THE MANY ENTANGLEMENTS involved in the operation of the private swimming pool on the public property of the Roberson St. Community Center in Chapel Hill haven't been fully worked out yet. But the private owners have made a formal request in writing for the Town to completely take over the pool and its operation after this year. Such a move, it is known, would be quite in keeping with the original intent of the donor of the three-year-old pool, Miss Cornelia Love. The Town administration seems basically favorable to the idea.

"WHATEVER LOLA WANTS," — a dance and vocal pastime accompanied by a tape recording of her own voice — will be the talent entry of Miss Orange County in the Miss North Carolina Pageant in Greensboro this weekend. She worked out the two minute and 24 - second routine last spring with the help of her room-mate at Elon College.

AN AUTHOR WITH A DRAMATIC flair for French Revolutionary history apparently wrote the press release issued this week by the Chapel Hill Committee for Open Business. One provision of the group's demands was for a progress report on local business desegregation by this coming Sunday, July 14, "Bastille Day." — Shades of storming the fortress of Town Hall.

REPORTING ON RECENT RACIAL demonstrations at Colonial Drug Store in Chapel Hill, Police Chief W. D. Blake noted he'd almost been run over himself while aiding a motorist to back out of one of the angle parking places at the curb there. Had he not been able to

hop up on the truck and ride the vehicle backwards, he'd likely have been flattened, he noted with a grim grin.

THERE IS NO NAME YET for the new hotel proposed for downtown Chapel Hill, its developers reported at a public hearing Monday night. In previous proposals (by different entrepreneurs) it has been reckoned variously as The Royal Carolinian Hotel and The Chapel Hill Hotel. The new developer, Interstate Investors, is understood to be a chain organization, so this could affect the local name.

TWO WERE ACQUITTED AND charges against three more yet remain to be heard in Chapel Hill Recorder's Court in connection with incidents during recent racial demonstrations. On Tuesday Franklin D. Horner was acquitted on assault with his auto on demonstrator James Gardner on grounds of insufficient evidence. UNC student Don Long from Mebane was found innocent of an affray with Negro Robert Russell following conflicting testimony in court. Russell is to be tried next week. Harold Clark of Carrboro is to stand trial tomorrow for reckless driving through the demonstrators' parade last Saturday. And Robert V. N. Brown will next Tuesday face assault charges brought by John Carswell in connection with Brown's picketing at Carswell's drugstore.

TRAINING FOR "CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE" of an un-announced nature has begun in Chapel Hill, according to a press release from the Chapel Hill Committee for Open Business. The integration group says it also plans a "massive demonstration" of at least 600 persons downtown this Saturday, as many as 1,000 in future demonstrations; a canvass for 1,000 signers on a petition for a public accommodations law; and a close watch on the Board of Aldermen and its voting record.

THE LONG JULY FOURTH holiday weekend was relatively accident free in Orange County, according to highway patrol men,
