## Four-H scholarship for study at Duke goes to Mary Fudge

Mary Beth Fudge, daughter of the Rev. and Mrs. Samuel Fudge of Route Two, Chapel Hill, has been named winner of a \$500 scholarship from the North Carolina Four-H Development Fund.

Miss Fudge, a senior at Orange High School at Hillsborough, is one of 12 Four-H'ers from across North Carolina selected to share in \$6,000 of scholarship money being distributed this year by the Fund.

president of the Fund, says the scholarship will be college study during the 1964-65 academic year.

The Four-H Development Fund, with headquarters at North Carolina State in Raleigh, was organized in 1958 by friends and alumni of Four-H to help support certain phases of club work. President Pou says this is the third year scholarships have been awarded. Recipients, he said, were selected on the basis of their high school record, evidence of college aptitude and Four-H Club record.

Mary Beth has compiled an extensive record of achievements in her six years of Four-H Club work. She has been state dress review winner and a delegate to

National Four-H Club Congress in addition to having won several local and county honors.

She has completed 15 projects and twice held the office of county Four-H president.

In addition to her Four-H work, she has maintained a high academic record, ranking first in her senior class of 92 this year. She is active in the Latin, French, Science, Beta and Monogram clubs; a member of the basketball team and a member of the newspaper and annual staffs. She has held a number of class offices, served as chief marshal and attended the Governor's School.

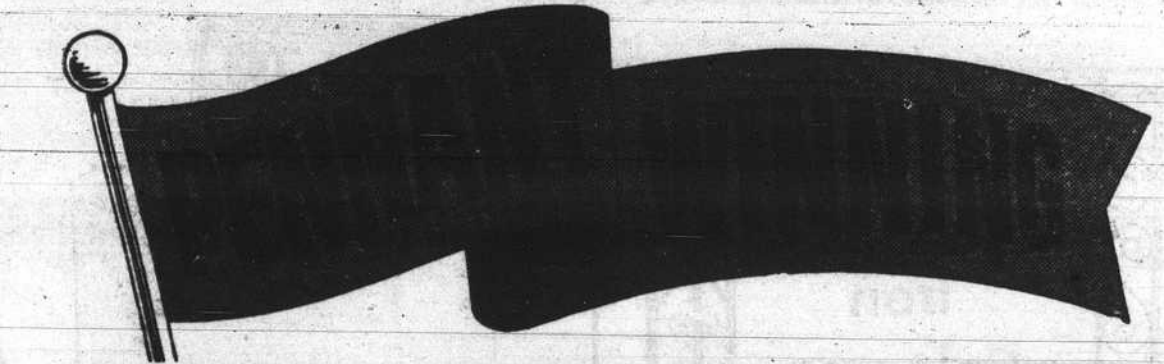
