2,600 at UNC to get degrees

Some 2,600 University of North Carolina graduates will be awarded degrees at the UNC 170th Commencement Exercises to be held June 1 at 7 p.m. in Kenan Stadium here.

It is the largest number of degrees ever to be awarded by the University or any other institution in the state.

Governor Terry Sanford will give the commencement address at the degree-awarding exercises.

The Reverend Olin T. Binkley, president of Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, Wake Forest, will give the baccalaureate sermon at 11 a.m., Sunday, June 2 at Memorial Hall.
