

Registration to close Saturday; 13,724 on books at beginning

The registration period for new voters will close in all of Orange County's 25 precincts as of sundown (7:15 p.m.) this Saturday.

County Board of Elections Secretary James N. Prothro of Chapel Hill said that brisk registration had been reported to date in some precincts—including a number of voters switching party affiliations—but that no figures were available.

Registrars will be in the precinct polling places from 9 a.m. till the sundown closing hour on Saturday to accept registrations. The books will not be re-opened for registration prior to any second primary, the elections official pointed out.

Of the 13,724 voters shown on the County's voting books when the new registration period began on May 2, the break-down by parties in the seven townships is as follows:

Paul G. Hoffman, the man who is to receive the American Freedom Association's 1964 World Peace Award at the University of North Carolina here at 8 p.m. tonight (Thursday), is a man who has spent the major portion of his life administering development of a variety of items including cars, countries, economics, and research.

The ceremonies will be held in Carroll Hall. Mr. Hoffman will be introduced by former UNC President Frank P. Graham, now a United Nations mediator. Gov. Sanford will be on the program.

As managing director of the U.N. Special Fund, Hoffman is concerned with developing the undeveloped in the underdeveloped world. This means administering monies to assist countries in surveying and defining their natural resources, in establishing training institutes for the inhabitants of these countries.

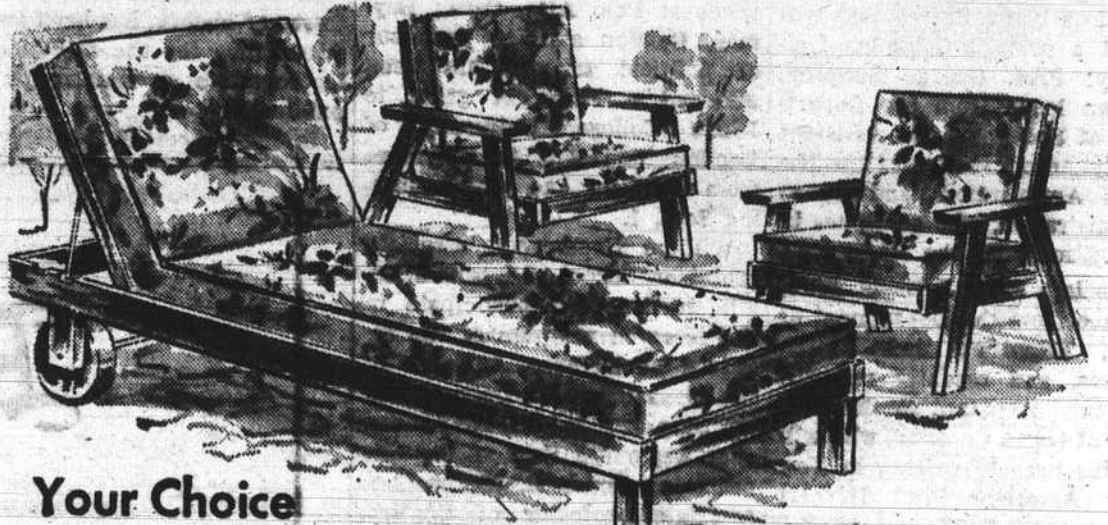

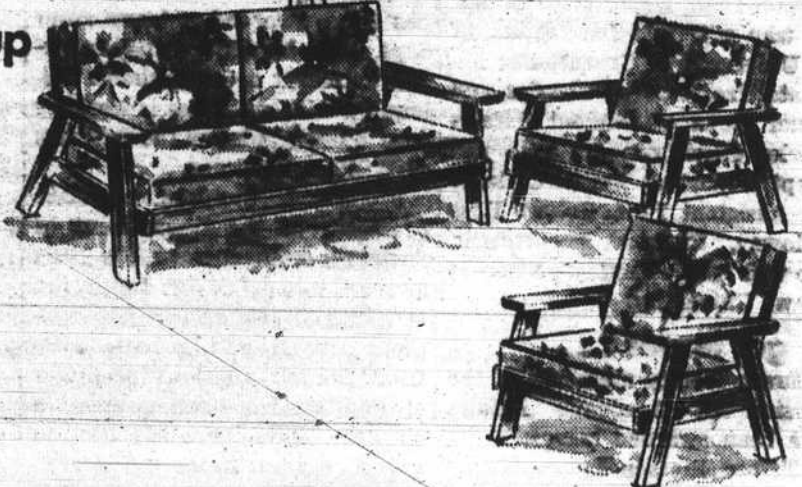
