**Concerned Citizens set visit to Washington**

The Committee of Concerned Citizens announced Saturday it will sponsor a visit to Washington June 1 by a statewide delegation of Tar Heels in support of the civil rights bill.

Dr. Joseph Straley, chairman of the group and a physics professor at the University of North Carolina, said the visit also is to "prepare plans for peaceful compliance after the bill has been enacted."

He added, "We have every faith that a strong bill will be enacted. We feel that responsible citizens will regard it as important to assist in the establishment of a climate for peaceful compliance."

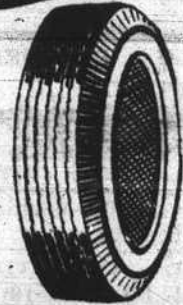
