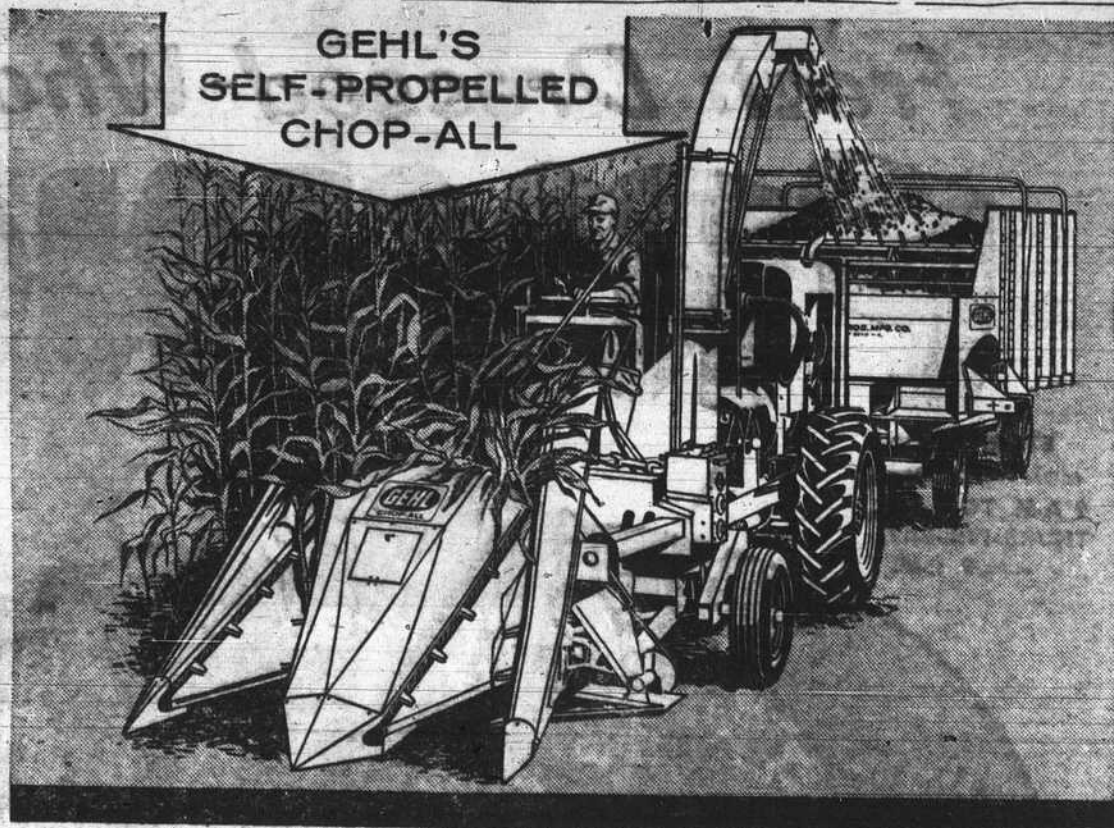
### Buffet honors officers of Democratic Women
