**LABOR DAY, MONDAY, WILL** be observed as a holiday generally by business, industry, government and education throughout Orange County. Stores, business and government offices will be closed except for necessary police duty. Banks and postoffices also will observe the legal holiday. At the latter, window service and carrier deliveries will be suspended, but mail will be distributed to boxholders and special delivery mail will be handled. Holiday collection and normal dispatches will be the rule. County schools will be closed for the day while Chapel Hill and the University have not yet opened the Fall terms.

**ONE INNOVATION FOR THIS** Labor Day will be the elimination of the annual sale of property liens for delinquent taxes at noon at the courthouse door. Instead, the tax sales will be held at the same location at noon tomorrow. The sale has been held on Labor Day since time immemorial, but tax officials, probably more anxious for a holiday than in previous years, have discovered the first Monday in September date is not a legal requirement.

**COUNTY BOARDS WHICH** have first Monday meetings will meet on Tuesday instead.

**THE SCHEDULED FIRST BATTLE** of Orange between the football teams of Hillsborough and Chapel Hill tomorrow night has been cancelled by Chapel Hill coaches because of the lateness of school opening in the city. The Panthers were unable to find another opponent, so the game schedule will begin a week from tomorrow.

**SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENTS** in the Town of Chapel Hill are strictly the responsibility of abutting property owners. This is the tentative and informal decision of the Chapel Hill Town Board in brief discussion of the matter recently. Interest was expressed in learning if and where property owners might want to have sidewalks paved in town. Bob Peck, Town Manager, explained that this can be done by regular assessment procedure over five years. The Town is equipped to do a bit of the sidewalk paving work itself if residents are interested enough in petitioning for it, it was agreed.
