Election officials have been asked to telephone a special un-listed number at the office in Chapel Hill, or the sheriff's office in Hillsborough to post the results of each race in the 25 precincts as the tallies are obtained.

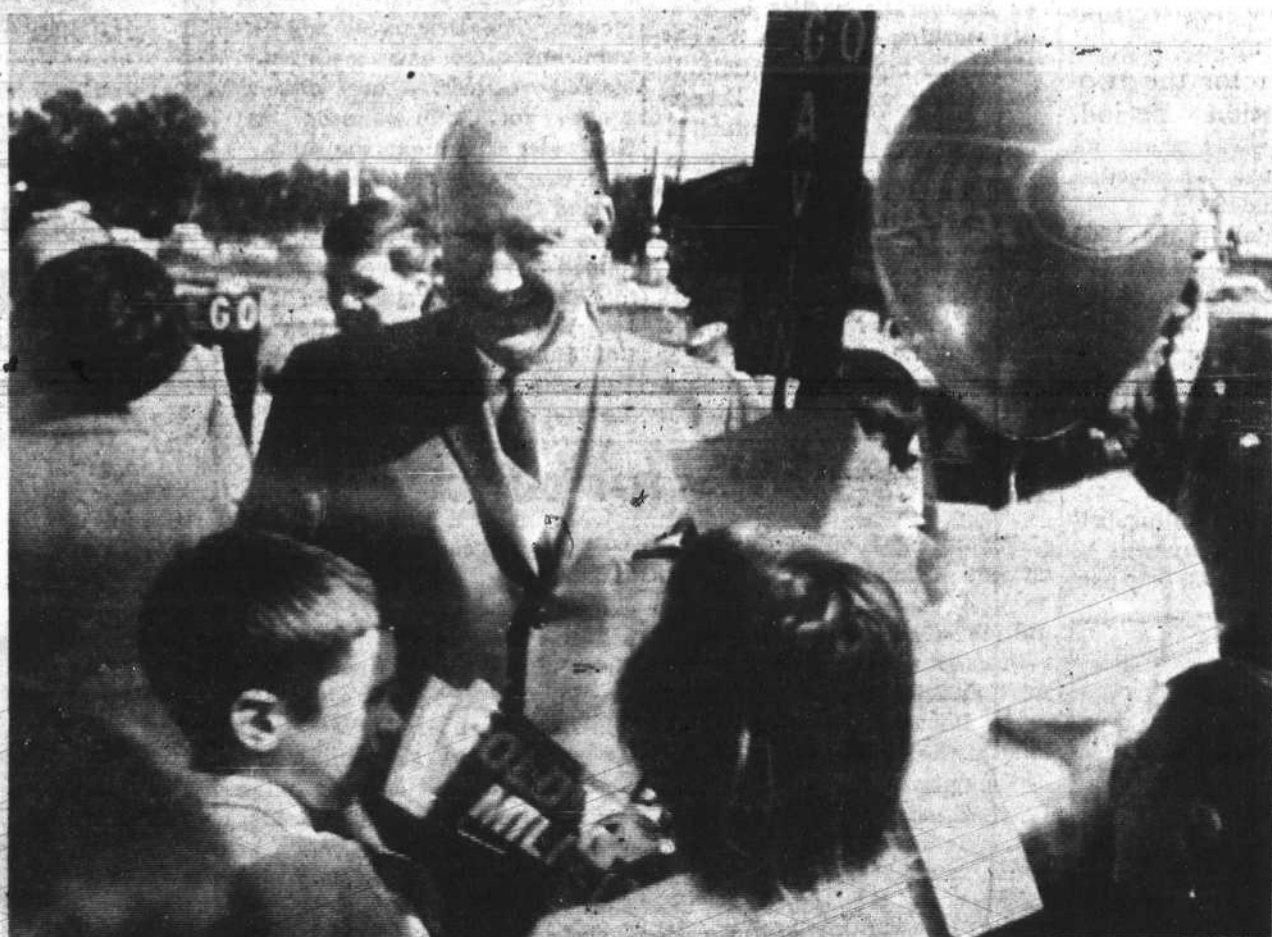
