of defense counsel;

Judge Raymond Mallard figuratively took the dual role of defense attorney and judge in freeing an indigent defendant charged with non-support in Orange County Superior Court this week. The defendant, Clarence D. Nabers, was called for trial Monday afternoon on non-support charges brought by his wife in 1961.

He appeared before the Judge without an attorney, stating that he couldn't afford a lawyer when the Judge asked him about this. Nabers admitted he had seldom made support payments for his minor child since 1961, stating that he just didn't have the money most of the time.

Judge Mallard was about to arrange for Nabers to have a courtappointed attorney as an indigent when he instead asked to see the formal charges against the defendant.
