Believing Husband Dead Woman Lost Her Life.

New York, Dec. 21.—An unfounded report of the death of her husband, from whom she had been separated for three years, has cost the life of Mrs. Catherine Shaffer at her home in Union Hill, N. J. Shaffer had been ill of pneumonia, but was recovering. A child of the couple who lived with the Shaffers was told on the street that he was dead. He ran home and broke the news. The mother became hysterical, passed from one convulsion to another and died in a few minutes.

Father of the Navy Dies at Ports mouth.

Portsmouth, Eng., Dec. 21.—Admiral Sir Erasmus Ommanney, the "father of the British navy," died today, after a lengthy illness. He was the last survivor of the battle of Navarino, fought in 1827, which resulted in the destruction of the Turkish fleet. The admiral was born in 1814, and entered the navy in 1826.

Storm Killed Fishermen

Lisbon, Dec. 20.—Much loss of life at sea has been caused by a sudden storm on the northern coast of Portugal.

From reports already received 18 fishermen were drowned at Figueira da Fez and 600 others have been rendered destitute. A ferryboat plying at the mouth of the Mondego River was capsized and 14 persons were drowned. In the Leixoes Basin, near Oporto, five boats were sunk and five persons drowned.

Daring Girls' Aerial Feat.

New Brunswick, N. J., Dec. 30.—Dared by their shopmates, Mary Cries, Margaret Kennedy, Lena Doheny and Mary Clinken, girls employed in the Cheeseborough Works, crossed the new Amboy Bridge, the approach to which is a flimsy ladder stretched out over the water 25 feet in the air. They crawled along the ladder, crossed to South Amboy and returned by train, the first women to cross the new structure.
