To Conserve the Nation's Resources. Advices in Jackson are that a mesage from Frankfort to the governonr was laconic and startling: "Hell has roken loose in Breathitt."

As some of the bloodiest affairs in he history of Kentucky have been fought in Jackson on political occasions, the State authorities have wastd on time in putting the town under nilitary surveillance.

Circuit Judge J. P. Adams, Republican candidate for re-election against D. B. Redwine, of Sandy Hook, Elliott county, sent a call for troops to the actin ggovernor, W. H. Cox, last nigt, declaring there were large forces of armed men espousing the respective Republican and Democratic causes hat the coutny officials were powerless and that a fight was imminent.

Jackeon, Ky., Nov. 1 .- A special rain with milita on board arrived before daylight. Detachments will be ent today to Crockettsville, War Creek, Sebastine Branch, Oakadale and other precincts where trouble is feared. This is the second time an election has been held in Breathitt county under protection of State troops.
