

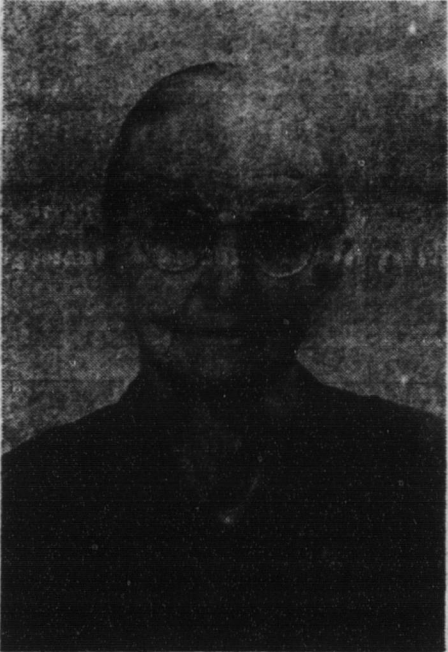

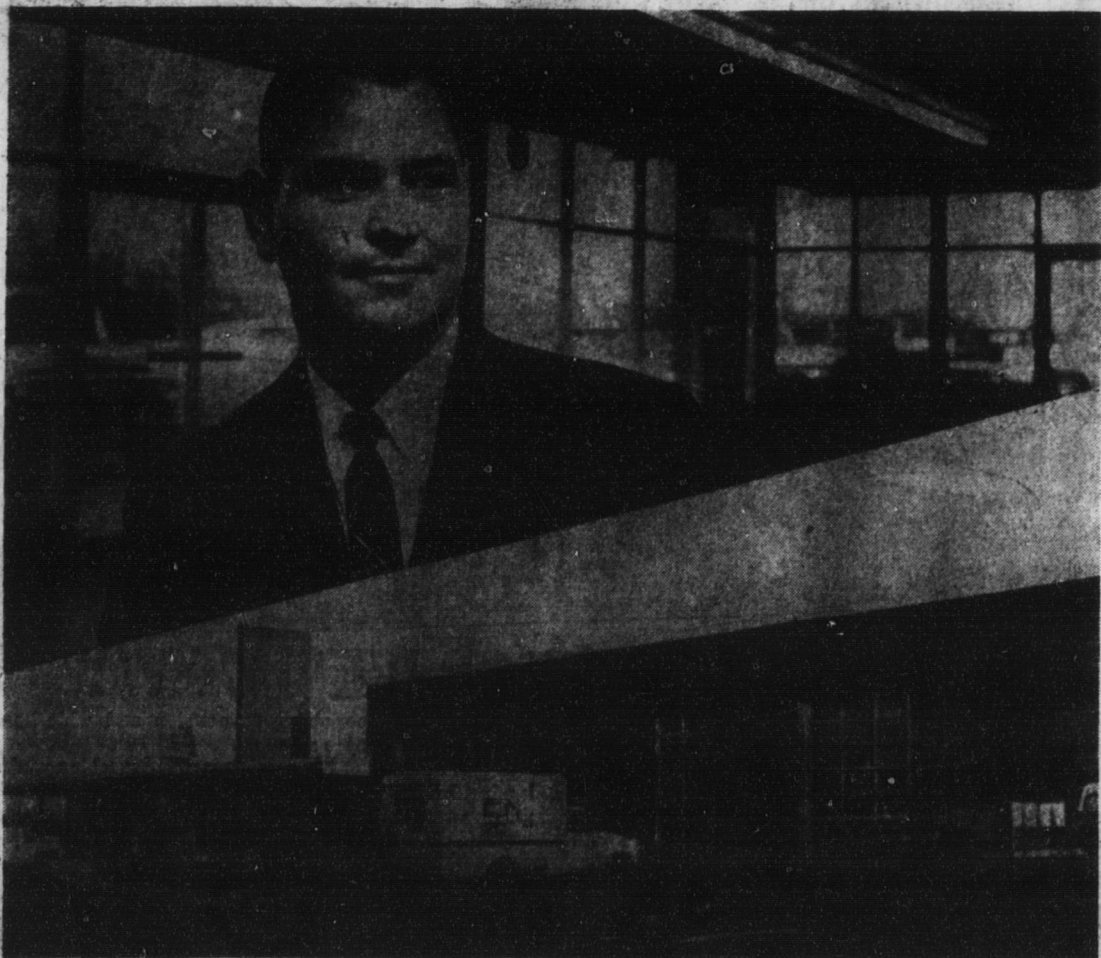
THIS PICTURE WAS MADE WHEN CLUB WAS FIRST ORGANIZED.

### Files For Office As Davie Sheriff

Walter Coy Broadway of North Mocksville, filed on January 19, as a candidate on the Republican ticket for sheriff of Davie County. He was born at North Cooleemee, and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Broadway of Route 4, Mocksville, and is married to the former Jancie Fleming of China Grove. They have three children.

Mr. Broadway attended Cooleemee Schools, is a member of Holy Cross Lutheran Church, the Mocksville Moose Lodge, and a veteran of World War II. He is 41 years of age and is employed by the Cooleemee Super Market in the Meat Department.

### Dr. Anderson Former Davie Dentist Died

Mocksville — Dr. Robert J. Indexter Anderson, 97, of Mocksville and Fort Myers, Fla., who had practiced dentistry here until he was 90 died Jan. 20 at his winter home in Fort Myers.

Dr. Anderson graduated from Vanderbilt University at Nashville, Tenn., and passed the North Carolina Dental Board in 1890. He returned to his home at Calahan in Davie County and with the help of a carpenter, he fashioned a dental chair on an old horse-drawn buggy. With this contraption, he visited Farmington, Fork, Smith Grove, Jerusalem and Cooleemee communities in Davie County, staying about a week in each place and serving patients.

One of his stops in 1893 was in East Bend. While there, he attended a family in the Old Richmond section of Forsyth County. One of his patients was Miss Flora Reed. Within a short time, he made her his wife. She is his only survivor.

He began his practice in Mocksville in 1892, but in 1896 a depression set in, and he and his wife moved to Brownsville, Tex. The climate did not agree with him and he returned to North Carolina in 1901, settling in Asheville. The next year he came back to Mocksville.

Dr. Anderson maintained his office on the square in Mocksville. He kept abreast of all modern equipment in the practice of dentistry with one exception. He could never operate anything but a drill powered by his foot.

For the past two years he has remained in Florida. Dr. Anderson was born in the Calahan section to A. A. and Fannie Poindexter Anderson. His father operated a store at Calahan, and one room was rented to a Dr. Howard, a Mocksville dentist. Howard's work interested young Anderson, and this led to his profession.

Mocksville — Knox Johnstone was elected chairman during Thursday night's organizational meeting of the Davie County Citizens Committee for Better Schools.

The committee previously had been authorized by the Davie County Board of Education and will serve a two-fold purpose: to investigate and counsel the board on school building needs and supplementary salaries for teachers.

Other officers elected included C. T. (Script) Robertson, vice chairman; Mrs. Paul M. Johnson secretary; and Mrs. William E. Hall, publicity chairman.

It was decided to let the officers appoint the executive committee to represent each of the county's seven townships. The four officers reside in two townships, leaving five executive board members to be appointed.

Although the next meeting date was not announced, it was decided that the entire committee would tour the county schools within the next several weeks.
