

Davie Watershed Project Sent To Congress

Mocksville - The badly battered Dutchman Creek tershed project, on which numerous Davie County residents have spent numerous months of work, was one of Congress on Monday by the budget bureau.

All 50 projects had been held up by the bureau be-cause of President Johnson's position that they should be acted upon by Congress itself rather than just by committees of Congress, a spokesman said.

He said the list was sent to Congress with the understanding that in the future such projects will go before the House and Senate for action.
