755 STUDENTS ENROLLED AT COOLEEMEE; 4101 IN DAVIE

The first day enrollment in the schools of Davie County totalled 4,101.

Davie County School Superintendent, James E. Everidge, said that this figure was expected to increase by the end of this week.

Rev. Benny Bearden is pastor of the church.

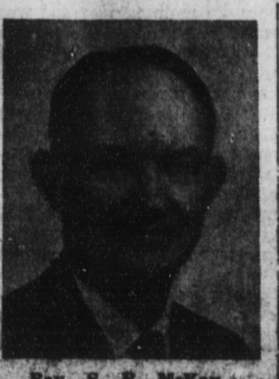
Robert Campbell Died Tuesday
