Former Superintendent Dies In Wreck In Va.

T. C. Pegram, 74, who was superintendent at Erwin Mills here until transferred to Durham in 1951, and Mrs. Pegram were killed in an automobile accident in Virginia last Thursday.

Mr. Pegram apparently suffered a heart attack. Their car ran off the road and hit a culvert. Both seat belts were attached, and no other car was involved.

Mr. Pegram died about a hour after being taken to a hospital. Mrs. Pegram was dead on arrival.

The couple was driving from their home in Durham to visit their only daughter, Betty Faison Sessions and her family in Silver Springs, Md. Survivors include Mrs. Sessions and three grandchildren.

Mr. Pegram began work with Erwin Mills around 1930. He retired about five years ago. While in Cooleemee, he was chairman of the board of stewards at the Methodist Church.

Funeral services were conducted at Asbury Methodist Church in Durham on Saturday. Burial was in Lakewood Cemetery in Durham.

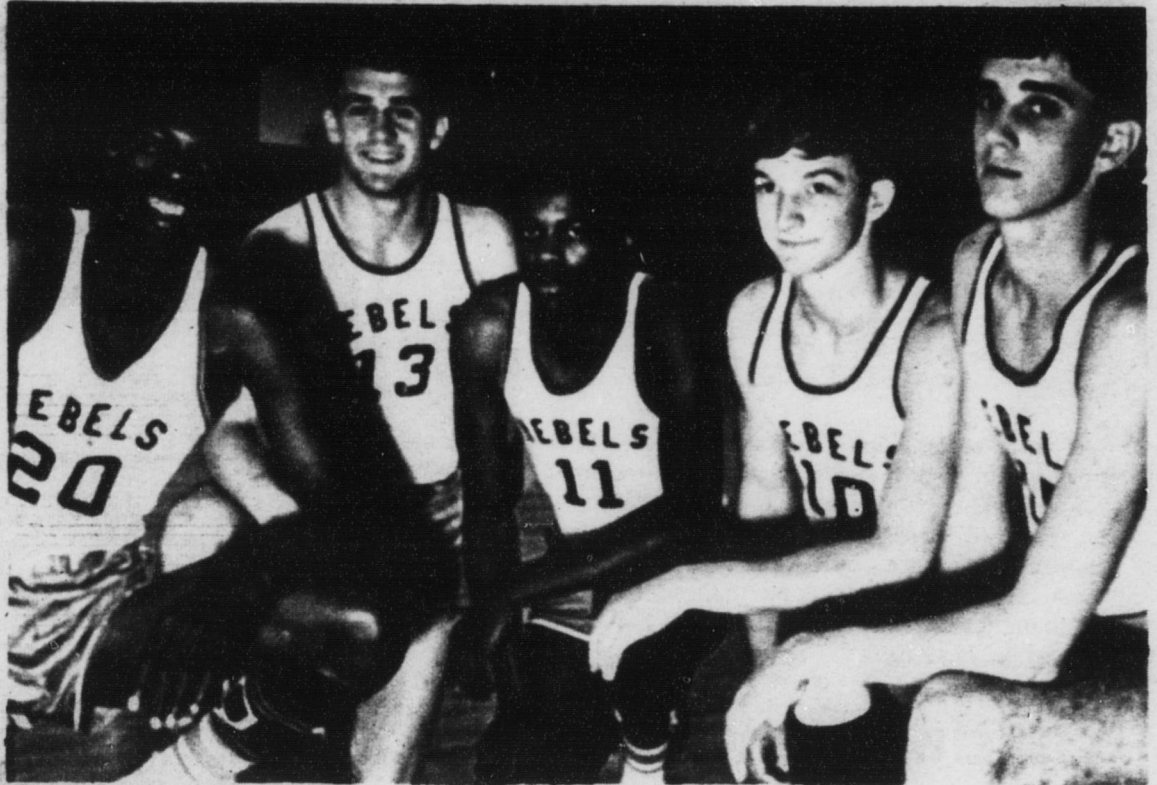
