Davie Goes For Scott, Gardner

Dr. Slate Leads Republican Ticket;
Naylor, Hicks To School Board

Dr. Francis Slate led the field by a wide margin as Davie Republicans selected three nominees for the county commission Saturday.

Others selected were Sam Daywalt and Charles (Buddy) Alexander in close voting. Dr. Slate received 1669 votes, Daywalt 1141 and Alexander 1073.

Following closely in the unofficial returns were I. H. (Cokie) Jones, 1047; J. Clay Tutterow, 1022; Fred Ellis, who has been called to active duty with the reserves, 835; and Lorin Mixon, who withdrew because he is moving, 128.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Benny Naylor and Claude Hicks were elected to the Davie County Board of Education in a nonpartisan vote. They polled 2465 and 2021 votes respectively.

Hudson Hoyle ran a strong third with 1976 votes while Booker T. Williams had 830 and Allen E. Wenn has 789.

STATE RACES

Bob Scott and Jim Gardner both piled up majorities in the gubernatorial primaries.

Scott was favored by Davie Democrats by 1098 votes to Mel Broughton's 479 and Dr. Reginald Hawkins' 404.

Gardner polled 1973 Republican votes to Jack Stickley's 472.

CONGRESSIONAL RACE

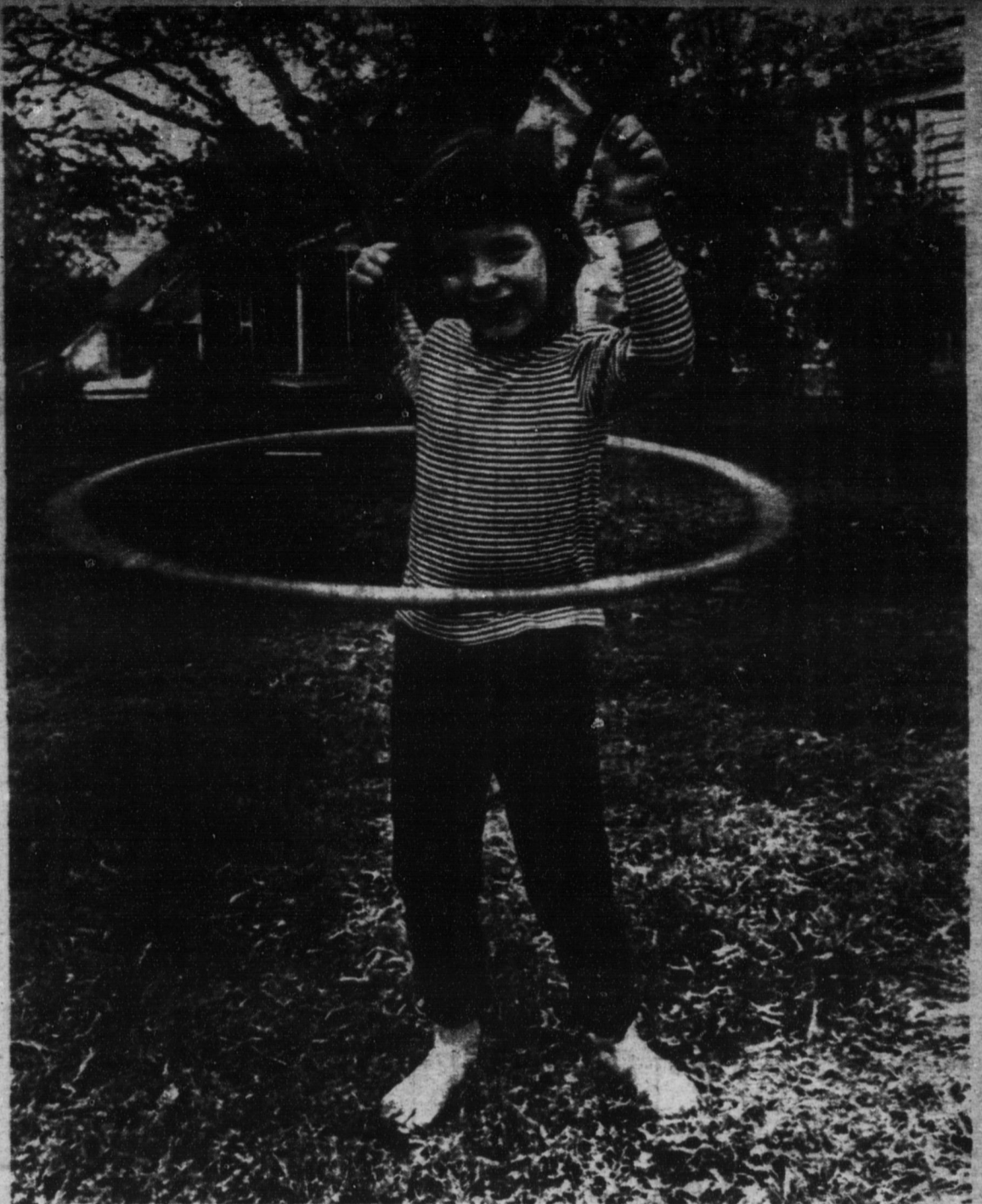
Davie County favored the winners in the congressional primaries, giving Democrat Smith Bagley 1145 votes and Wilmer (Vinegar Bend) Mizell 1492.

Bagley's opponent James G. White received 651. Republicans gave Eldon Nielson 703 votes and Howard Duggins 107.

OTHER ELECTIONS

Robert A. (Bob) Collier Jr. of Statesville, who led the three-man ticket over George Saintising of Thomasville and William R. Pope of Mooresville. Saintising, who ran in the district, can call a run-off. He led the voting in Cooleemee.

Republicans in Farmington nominated L. K. Howard over R. L. (Bob) Smith as constable. Davie Republicans also favored J. W. Norris as state senator.

The nominee must live in Jerusalem Township.

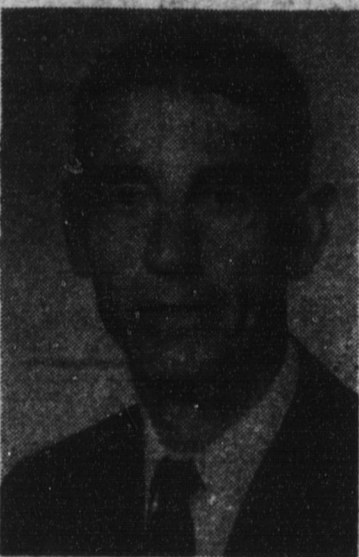
An essay giving reasons for your nomination must be submitted to Lion Fred Pierce or any member of the Cooleemee Lions Club, no later than May 31, 1968.
