Davie Wins Little League Crown

Cooleemee's Sidney Nail and Mocksville's Randy McDaniel provided the heavy artillery as Davie County's Little Leaguers routed Rowan for the Area Championship for 12 year olds. The score was 14-2.

Nail, batting in the lead-off spot, greeted the Rowan starter with a home run over the fence at McDaniel Field Monday night. McDaniel, batting second, put him in check with a second out-of-the-park blast.

This set the tone of the game with Davie batters rapping 15 hits, including four by pitcher McDaniel and two by Nail and Cooleemee shortstop Ricky Glass.

The victory gave Davie the championship after having defeated China Grove in the opener, Rowan in the semifinals and Rowan in the finals of the double elimination affair. Davie never lost.

Following Nail and McDaniel's opening homers, Davie went on to score three more runs and salt away the game before Rowan ever came to bat. Billy Hall, Bobby Anderson and Ricky Glass followed with singles to load the sacks. After a force-out at home, Robert Anderson plated Bobby Anderson and Glass with a timely single. Jeff Ward singled in the fifth run of the inning. Glass was at bat for the second time when Anderson was nailed at the plate trying to score after a wild pitch.

In the second inning, Nail singled and raced home on McDaniel's double. Bobby Anderson singled to score McDaniel.

With two outs in the third, McDaniel crashed another double, and David Dwiggin's plated him with a double.

Mrs. Edgar Bowers Is Robbed, Tied, Gagged In Holdup

Mrs. Edgar Bowers whose husband was killed in Vietnam last month, went through another ordeal last week.

While working alone at the Western-Southern Life Insurance office on Statesville Boulevard Wednesday, she was held up by three Negro youths, tied, gagged and robbed.

The bandits stole \$43.43 of company money and took \$30 from Mrs. Bowers.

Three suspects later were apprehended by Salisbury police. They were Lumar Frazier, 22, of Miami, Fla.; George Edward

Pulliman, 17 and William Timothy Parks, 16, both of Lexington. Salisbury Police Chief Dave Shuler said they also were charged with a robbery in Lexington.

Mrs. Bowers, the former Nancy Owens of Mt. Ulla, was notified July 16 that her husband, Edgar, 20, had been wounded in Vietnam. Two days later she was notified that he had died of wounds sustained in action against the enemy.

Bob Ijames Drowns Trying To Save Mother At Junction

Bob Ijames, 33, drowned Sunday at The Junction after he jumped in the water in an attempt to rescue his mother and three others after their boat overturned.

David (Inky) Harris, of Edgewood Circle, who was boating nearby, kicked in the window of the Ijames boat to save Bob's mother, Queen Ijames. She was pinned under the boat which had overturned.

Meanwhile, Ijames, who had been in the Navy for nine years and recently worked at the mill under Grimes Parker, went under and drowned. His body was recovered about 15 minutes after the accident, which occurred about 7 p.m. Sunday.

Rescue squad members were hampered in getting into the site, which occurred near the boat landing at the White ac-

cess area at Cooleemee Junction.

The milling crowd even delayed getting the body to shore for several minutes after the rescue squad recovered the body in about 20 feet of water.

BOAT LEAKS

Rescue squad members said that Ijames, his mother and three other companions apparently were starting to launch the motorboat when the incident occurred.

Squad members said the boat was about a 12-foot long craft equipped with about a 50-horsepower motor — much too much power for the length of the craft.

Ijames reportedly was on shore as the boat was being launched. Squad members said
