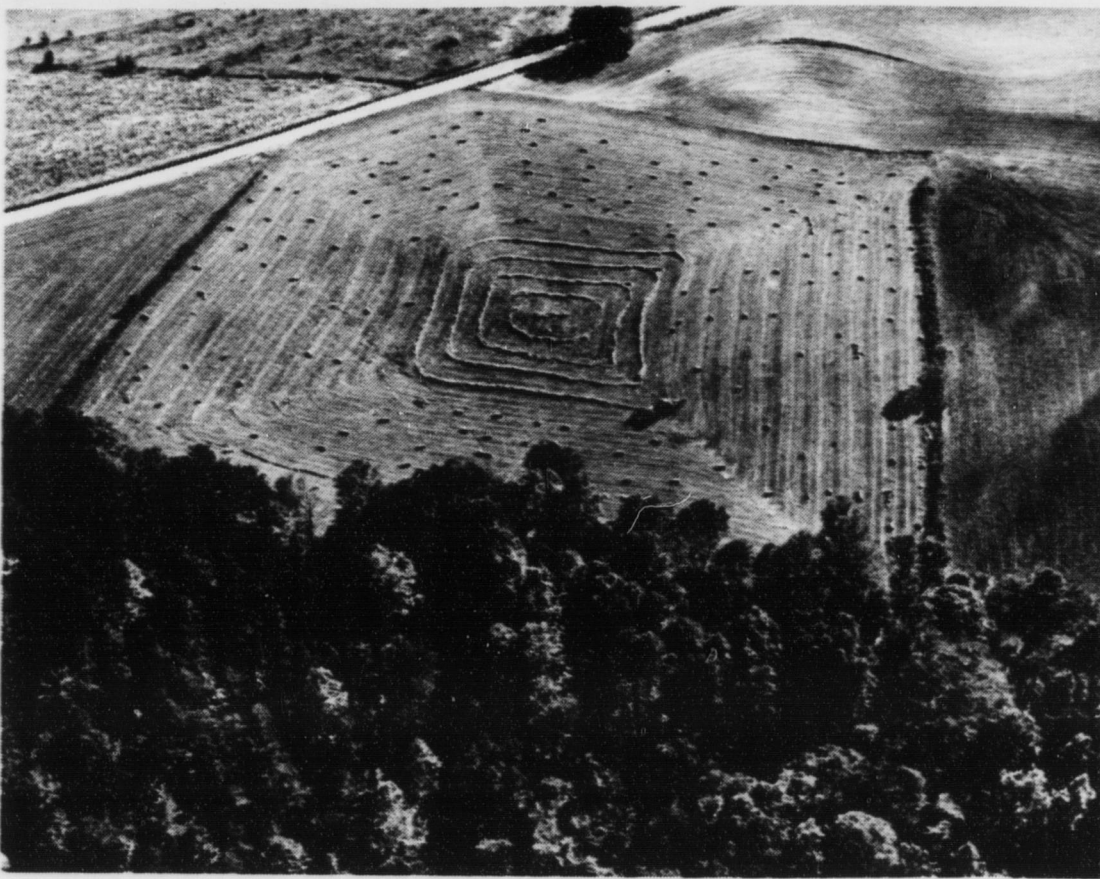

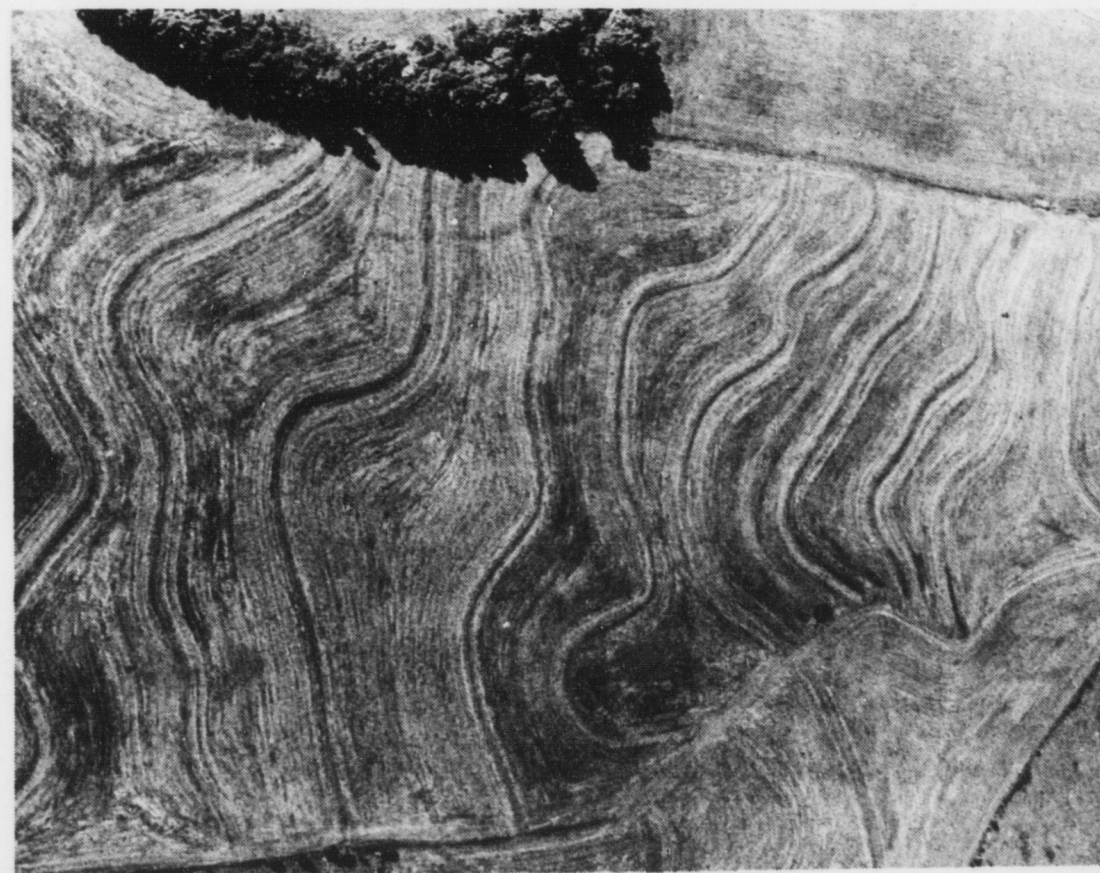
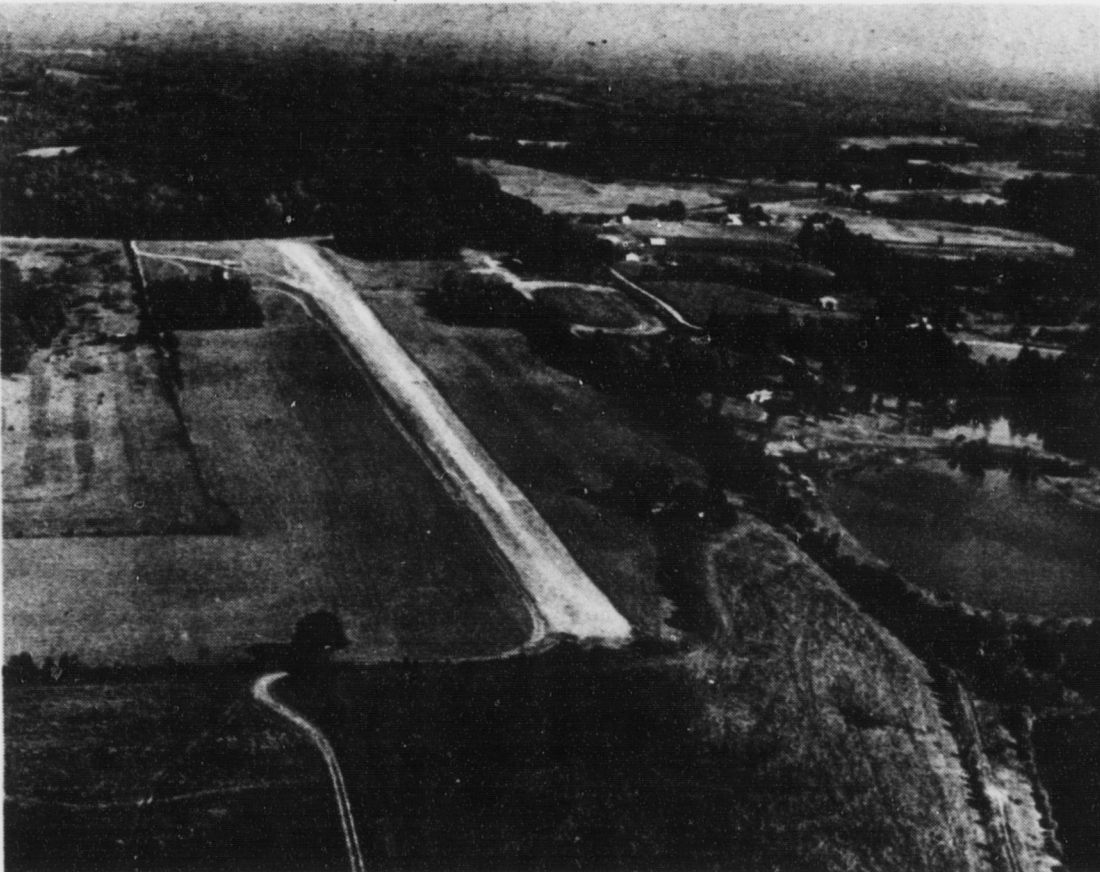

UNC Group Will Study Problems

CHAPEL HILL (AP) — A 60-member committee is being set up at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill to achieve wider expression of viewpoints on important issues.

Chancellor Carlyle Sitterson said Monday the committee will "undertake a thorough exploration of how within our setting and tradition we may build a greater sense of common purpose in approaching campus-wide concerns."

The committee will be called the Consultative Forum. Sitterson will serve as chairman and the first meeting will be held in November.

Sitterson said he had asked the student body president, Alan Albright of Gastonia, to appoint 15 students. Frederic Cleveland, chairman of the faculty, will appoint 15 faculty members.

Sitterson will select 15 representatives from the administration and nonacademic staff.

Consolidated University President William Friday has been asked to recommend that the board of trustees appoint eight of its members to the committee. The president of the UNC Alumni Association, Harry Montgomery of Raleigh, will name six alumni to serve.
