Potter To Head NC Central Bank

Literacy Survey Upcoming

A survey to provide current information on the national background as well as the literacy of the U.S. population will be conducted by the Bureau of the Census in November.

Interviewing in this area will take place during the week of November 16, according to Joseph R. Norwood, Director of the Bureau's regional office in Charlotte. The information is needed to improve the efficiency of a variety of government programs. Facts on literacy and national origin of the population have not been collected for a decade.

This special survey will be conducted as a part of the monthly national survey of employment for the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor which furnishes a basic measure of the Nation's economic health.
