Mr. James Armstrong, president of Western Carolina Telephone Company, said this week that the company will support the decision of the citizens of the town of Cooleemee concerning the incorporation issue.

Mr. Armstrong further commented that in the near future the local telephone company will have a very large investment in a new dial office, on the land which was purchased from Burlington Industries last fall. This office will be located within the proposed corporate boundaries. If the citizens vote in favor of

incorporation, Western Carolina will be a mojor tax payer and will support this 100 per cent.

Mr. Armstrong expressed a deep interest and concern for the future growth of the town and the company desires to be a part of this growth, which has very good potentials in the future.

Will Streets Be Paved If Town Incorporates?

One of the questions that a number of the local residents have been asking lately is "Will the streets, that the state had previously agreed to pave, be paved if the town becomes incorporated?"

State Highway Commissioner, G. E. McNeal of Jonesville said last week that all the streets will be paved and whether the town becomes incorporated or not will have no bearing on the issue whatsoever. He further commented that the only reason for not paving the streets that were agreed on, would be if the residents on these streets would not give them the right-of-way.
