Have You Signed Cooleemee Sanitary District Petition?

John Barber, county manager said this week that although a large number of persons have already signed the Cooleemee Sanitary District Petition, there have been others who have not had the opportunity. This is expected to be remedied in the next few days when those areas not yet covered will be completed.

The petition is asking the County Commissioner to form a sanitary district in Cooleemee for the purpose of assuming responsibility for the water and sewage distribution system.

Burlington Industries has served notice of their intentions to give up this service.

According to the General Statute of North Carolina, the public hearings for the sanitary district, which will be conducted by the State Board of Health, cannot be held 60 days prior to or 60

days following a general election.

This means it will be January before much action can take place.

The State Board of Health was notified on October 16th of the purpose of the petition and Mr. T. G. Groom, Regional Engineer for the N. C. State Board of Health in the Asheville office, has been instructed to assist in clearing up the necessary details for the sanitary district.

Vote Recount Gives Little Change

No significant changes occurred in the recount of the votes of the North Mocksville and Cooleemee precincts on Monday night.

These two precincts were recounted because a tally sheet, misplaced during the counting in the North Mocksville precinct on November 3rd, gave additional votes to the Democratic candidates in the official canvass last Thursday. Some questions were also raised about the count in Cooleemee and the board of elections decided to recount both boxes to remove any doubt about the accuracy of the totals.
