> penses, excluding foreign loans in taxes, in eash, and two thirds as loans to be repaid in another generation, is indicated by treasury figures of collections from various sources. With the last four days of the year not yet labulated, receipts from taxes, customs and miscellaneous reveque amounted to \$5,697.063,000, of which \$2,950,032,000 came from income and excess profits taues alone. \$1,124,518,000 from other federal faxes; only \$171,-Cl0.000 from custom duties on imports, and the balance or about \$6,038,000,000 has come into the treasury from the Fourth Liberty Loan. In addition, \$13,802,600. worth of certificates of indebtedness have been sold and subselouenty largely redeemed from Liberty Loan receipts. War says ingo stamps and certificates have
