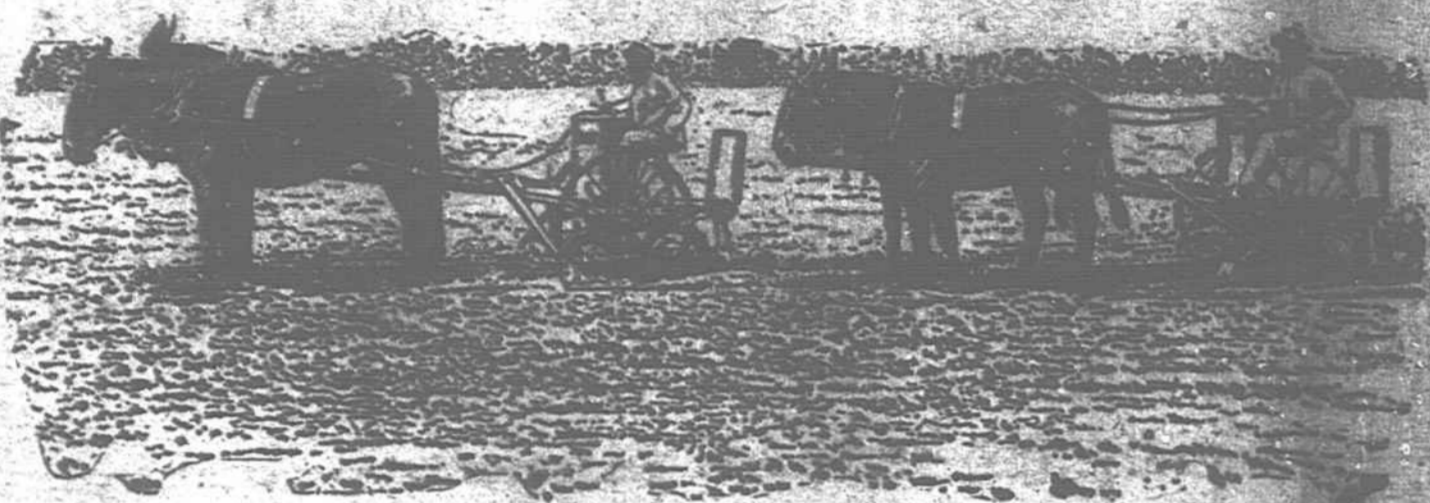

HOW ONE MAN CAN DO THE WORK OF FOUR OR FIVE, AND ONE TEAM THE WORK OF THREE

Gentlemen:—I operated two of your Iron Age cotton planters on Cotton Valley Farm, Tarboro, N. C., owned by Senator Geo. A. Holderness, and I am very much pleased with the work it did. It distributed the seed evenly and at the proper depth. The fertilizer was distributed in any quantities desired.

With one man and two mules operating one of these planters I was able to do the same work that formerly required four men and six mules, and the work was done really better than when done with the one-horse implements formerly used. After a man had operated one of these machines for a day or two he was able to plant about seven acres per day.

I regard it as the most satisfactory cotton planter on the market today, and any man that plants as much as 30 acres in cotton will find it a great labor saver.

COTTON PLANTERS

The Iron Age Cotton Planter works and greatly improves the usual method of planting because it opens the furrows, sows fertilizer where it cannot injure the seed, makes the list with the covering disc, at the same time mixing the soil and fertilizer and leveling the list to any desired height of seed-bed, opens a seed furrow, sows the seed, covers it, rolls it, and marks next row.

By combining operations a clear saving of at least \$10 a day is made—enough saved in a few days to pay for the machine. Combining all operations into one also prevents drying out of the soil, as generally occurs when the ground is worked over several times. This machine also plants the seed immediately into a fresh, moist seed-bed, assuring a quick, healthy start for the plant.

Notice especially that the fertilizer does not come in contact with the seed, as it is thoroughly mixed with the soil and the list made up before the seed is planted.

This machine can also be converted into a row maker for small crops, preparatory to sowing small seeds. A Corn, Bean and Pea Attachment can also be obtained for this machine, making a trucker's planter that meets the popular demand.

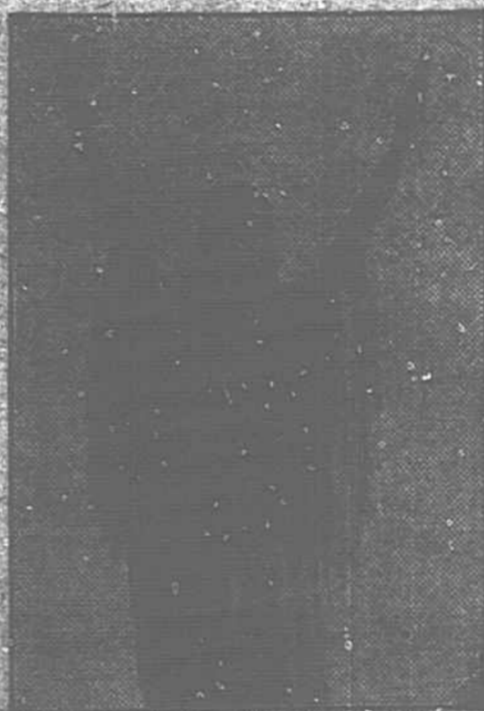

INDIAN PRINCESS GOES OVERSEAS AS Y. M. C. A. WORKER

Princess Galliohi, Descended From Cherokee Chieftain, Joins Canteen Forces in France.



A real, sure-enough Indian Princess is going to France to help sustain the American soldiers and sailors and the last one of them has been returned to the United States.

She is Princess Galliohi, great granddaughter of the famous King Coosawattee, chief of the Cherokees, and her mission in France will be in connection with the eastern work of the Y. M. C. A. Her Americanized name is Miss Anne Ross and for two years or more she has appeared as a lecturer, singer, dancer and exponent of the tribal life of her chosen people. She was chosen to pose for the Zolnay statue of Sequoia, an ancestor of the Cherokee nation and inventor of the tribal alphabet. This statue stands in the Hall of Fame at Washington, D. C.

The princess will have a rather diversified program. She will sing Indian songs and dance Indian dances for the American soldiers and sailors and between times will dispense the dozens of different articles that are part of the stock of every Y. M. C. A. canteen. She is highly educated and has several times acted as a mediator between her people and the white residents of Oklahoma, her native state.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Farmville, N. C., at Town Hall in Farmville, N. C., until 2 p. m., April 10, 1919, for Street Improvements.

The work will consist of about: 25,000 or 50,000 sq. yds. of Asphalt, Bitulithic, Brick or other pavement. 15,000 lineal feet of Granite or Concrete Curb. 20,000 lineal feet of Concrete Gutter. 20,000 sq. yds. of Sidewalks. And the necessary grading and drainage, etc. It is expected that additional work will be done later.

Proposals must be marked, "Proposals for Street Improvements."

All bids must be upon blank forms provided in the Proposal and Contract and Specifications.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check for \$2,000.00 as evidence of good faith.

Plans and Specifications will be on file at the Clerk's office in Farmville and at the office of the Engineer in Durham, N. C., and copies of the specifications, form of proposal, etc. will be mailed upon application to the Engineer at Durham, N. C.
