England Pushes Ireland Hard for the Honor of Sending Native Sons to Stores of United States.

Washington.—There are 1,705,387 foreign-born white persons in the United States as shown by the 1920 census, it was announced.

The total population of the United States is 106,720,000. Thus, it appears that slightly more than one-tenth of the population is foreign born.

During the last decade, the foreign-born population of this country has increased by only 365,445 persons, or 2.3 per cent. The census bureau announces that this small increase is due to the almost complete cessation of immigration during the world war.

The increase in the previous 10-year period, regarded as normal, was 1,111,718 persons.

The largest part of the foreign-born population of this country comes from Germany, whose nation has sent 1,082,200 persons to America.

Italians are second in number among the population which is of foreign birth with 1,07,458 persons. Russia is third with 1,285,915 persons, Poland is fourth with 1,139,579, and Ireland fifth with 1,085,600.

Cabinet Crisis imminent.

She agrees that failure by Germany to meet her obligations in this respect should be met with further pressure.
