

RED CROSS WINNING IN FIGHT FOR HEALTH

Better, Stronger Citizens Now
Emerging Out of Work in
United States.

The American Red Cross as an evangelist of better health has looked its probing square in the face. How it accepted the task revealed to it in the nation's physical condition as brought out during the World War, and conscientiously applied its activities to correction forms a vivid chapter in the forthcoming annual report. Heroically and patiently, nursing is a force in the Red Cross. In its public-health nursing service, in its strenuous air-raid patrols and care of the sick, nutrition classes, first aid and life-saving courses and health centers, the American Red Cross is applying effectively the lessons learned during the war and making for a healthy, vigorous and better informed citizenry.

The task of the Red Cross Public Health nurse in the 1,210 nursing services now operating throughout the country, instructing their communities in health essentials and disease prevention is demonstrating the possibility of higher birthrate and the great benefits of sterilization.

During the last year 313 new public health nursing services were established by Red Cross Chapters, and several hundred services so convincingly proved their usefulness that they were taken over by public authorities. In order to promote this work \$30,000 was allotted in providing women to prepare themselves for public nursing. The home visits made by the 1,210 nurses aggregated nearly 1,500,000 visits to schools numbered 140,000, and in six months 1,250,000 school children were screened by these nurses and where defects were found received examination by physicians. In rural communities this service has made a very marked advance and has won thousands of converts to approved methods of disease prevention.

In home hygiene and care of the sick foundation, which fits the students in methods of proper care where illness is not so serious as to require professional service, the Red Cross conducted 1,804 classes during the last year, involved 2,000 instructors, 20,000 students and issued 12,000 certificates.

On June 30, 1922, nutrition services numbered 3,192 classes with a total of 27,500 children and 1,000 enrolled dietitians. Seventy-eight food education classes graduated 100 who received Red Cross certificates. In dental health education, Red Cross Chapters conducted 577 dental clinics, while as many communities provided water health lectures for those interested, availing while clinics numbered 500.
