Mrs. Virginia Bynum died suddenly at her home about five miles from this city Friday morning. She had been in ill health for several weeks but was able to be up and her death came as a distinct shock and surprise to her relatives and friends throughout the county and state.

Mrs. Bynum was before her marriage Miss Virginia Bynum, and was born in this county, being the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Allen Bynum. She had just passed her 84th birthday. She survived her husband by 12 years and has since lived with her brother, Mr. William Bynum, at the old homestead.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon by Rev. O. E. Fox, pastor of the local Christian church, at 4:30 o'clock in the home, interment being made at Falkland.

Surviving Mrs. Bynum are several nieces and nephews, one sister, Mrs. Julia Barrett, of Kinston, and a brother, William Bynum.

Mrs. Bynum lived a quiet though industrious life and was greatly beloved by a large circle of friends and acquaintances.

ESCAPED CONVICT KILLED BY DEPUTY

Wilson, May 27.—Bud Woodward, negro, escaped convict from the Wilson county jail, was shot and instantly killed by a deputy sheriff in Greenville late Sunday afternoon, when he resisted arrest, according to word received here this morning.

Woodward was awaiting trial on two charges when he made good his escape from the Wilson jail, being charged with burglary and assault on a female. Woodward together with another negro, Will Taylor, wrenched the nuts from the bars to the window to their cell and escaped in the night, a chase followed, but they eluded the officers and nothing was heard from them until the local authorities were notified that Woodward had been killed in Greenville resisting arrest.

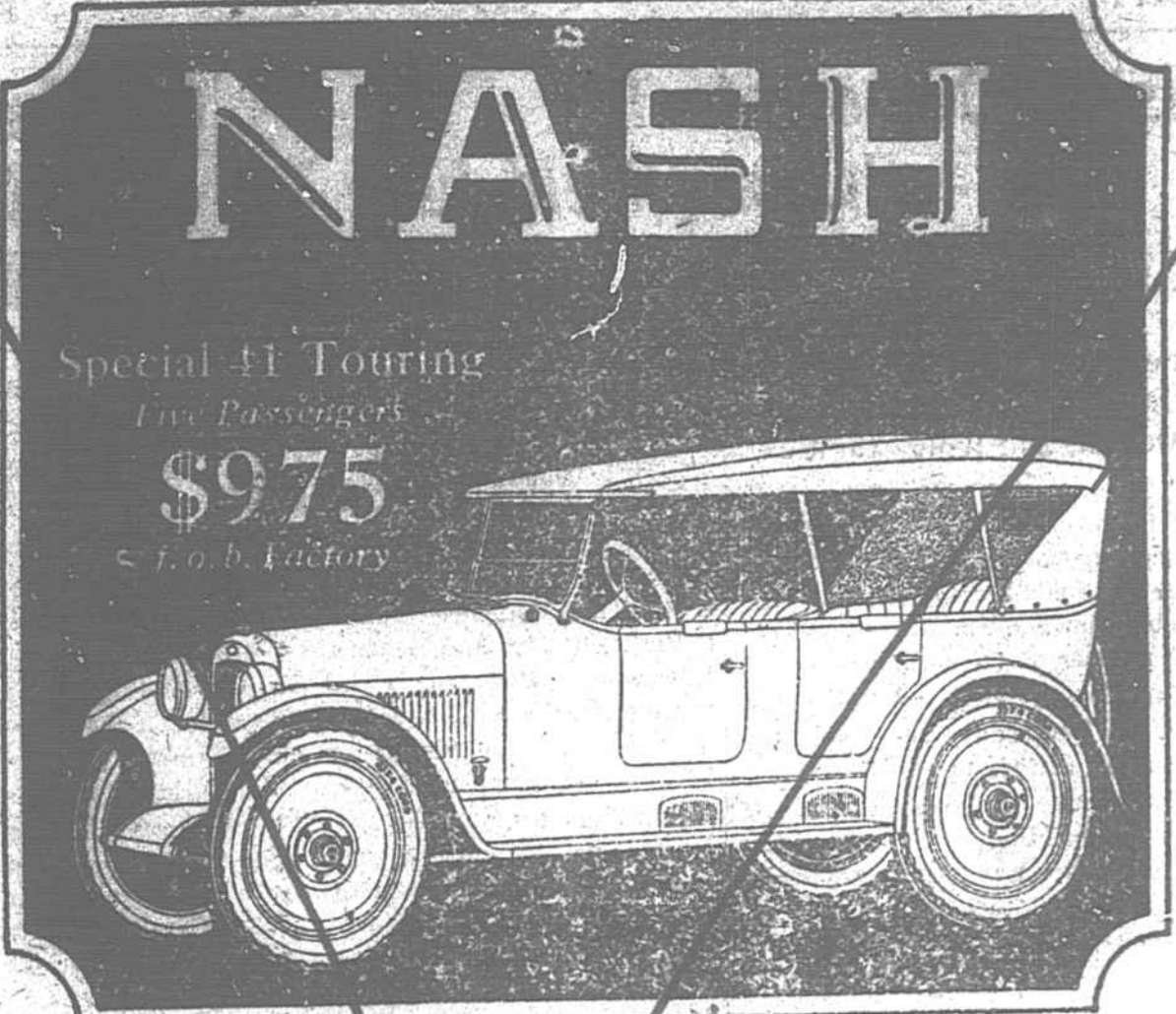
