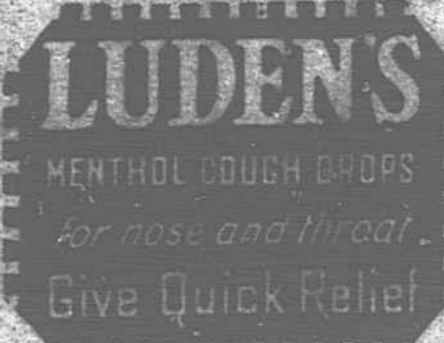

dead she is beginning to feel apologetic if she is not working.

Many severe criticisms have been hurled against women—that she becomes hardened—that she spoils the labor market for men—that she falls in her duty to society—lastly, that she has no head for business.

Today there is a national association of bank women, consisting of over 4,000. The president and assistant secretary of the great Columbia Trust Company in New York are women.

There are women manufacturers, mine operators, sales managers, railroad presidents, stockbrokers, representatives of tobacco growers associations, lawyers, doctors and various other professional occupations that men filled before the great war.

Many women have made fortunes in business for themselves. This gives them something to occupy their minds, to learn people, to secure the right friends, to broaden the mind, to serve humanity most. Then, let circumstances and her deepest desires guide the girl in her choice of that to which she wishes to give her best energies. She must work if she is to have any measure of happiness.
