The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. G. A. Jones. After roll call, the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. During a short business session the club women were asked to pledge themselves anew for the sale of Red Cross Seals. A committee composed of Miss Annie Perkins, Miss Tabitha De Visconti and Mrs. J. I. Morgan was appointed to plan most effectively the sale of seals, and to urge the people of Farmville to cooperate with us in our effort to eradicate the "Great White Plague" which is so disastrously sweeping over our State and Nation.

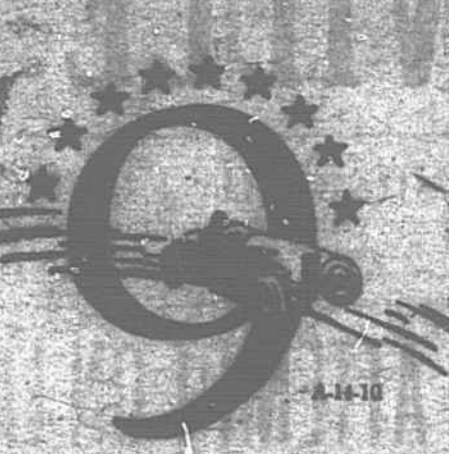

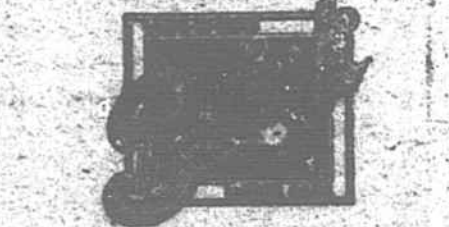
