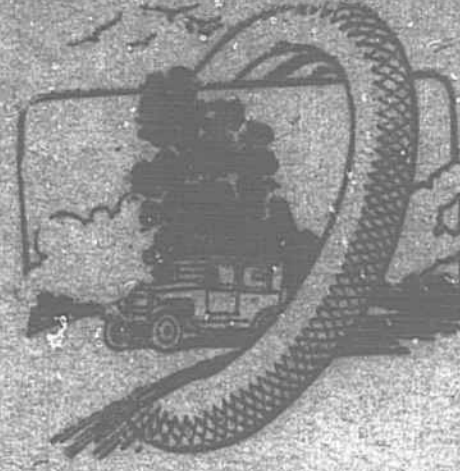

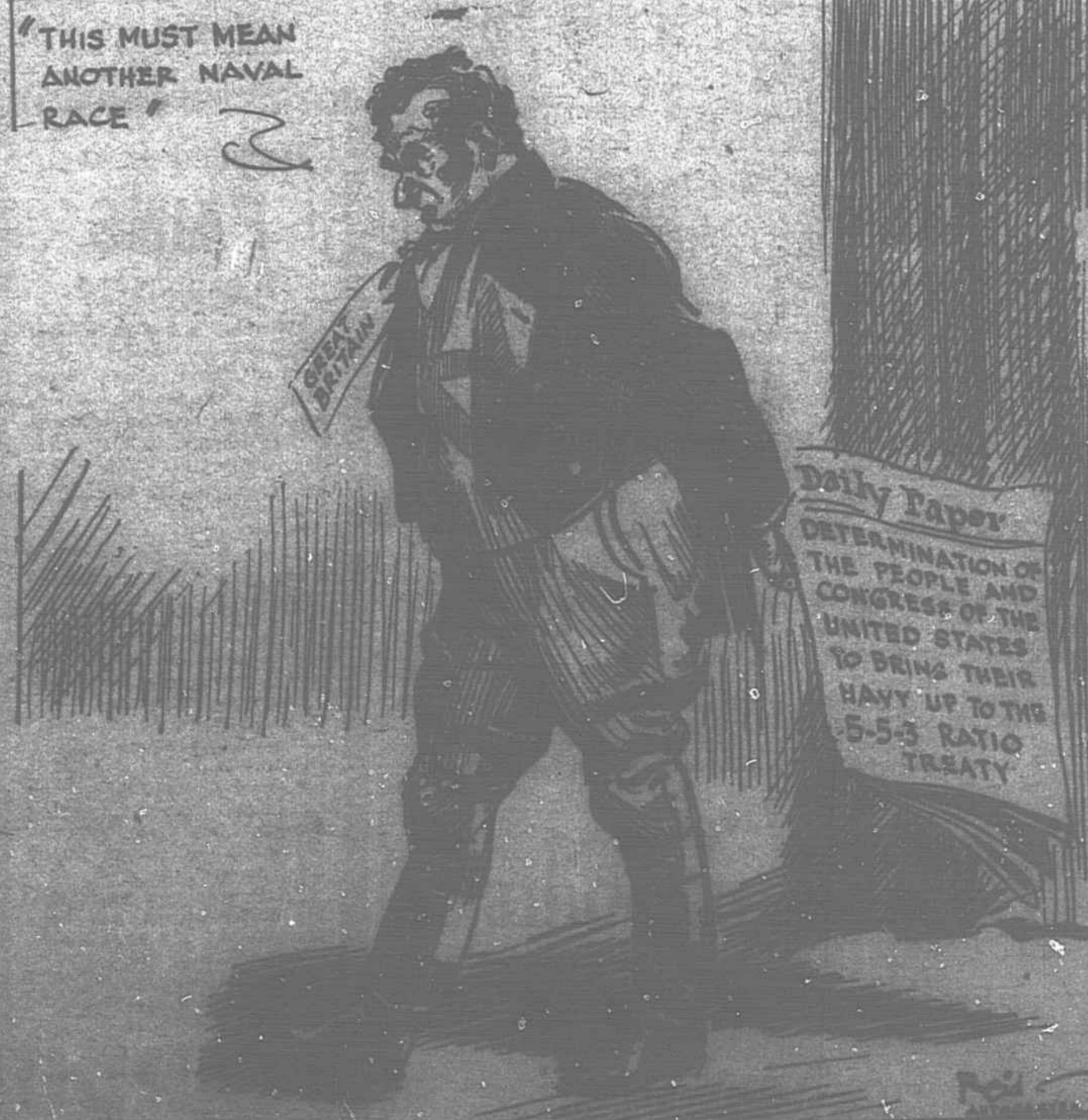
Rhode Island Red Takes Sweepstakes
