#### New Course Added

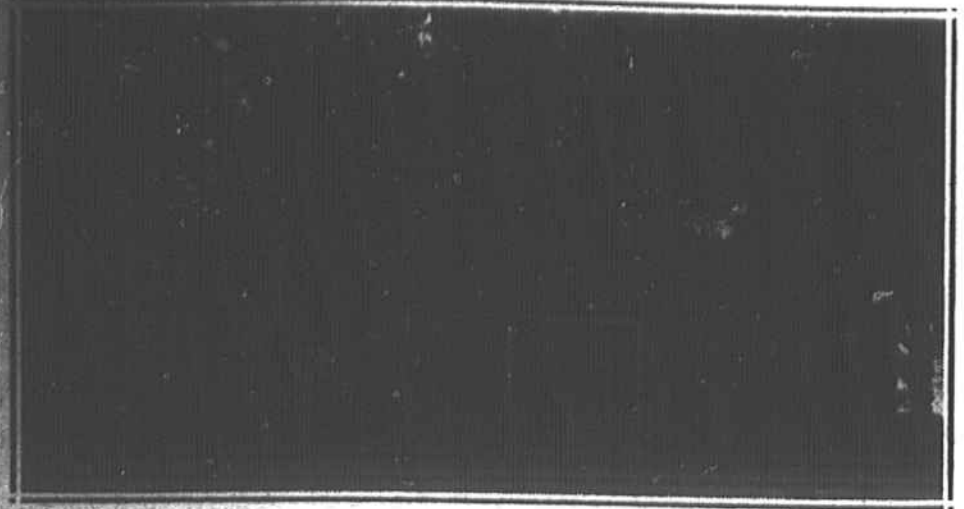
Economics was added to the Domes-

#### Economics Dept. To Have Cottage

A new addition, the only one of  
its type in the State, and one in

the Home Economics Cottage, now  
being remodeled for the use of this  
department. The building is situat-  
ed at the West corner of the campus,  
and was recently purchased from R.  
G. Barrett.

The renovation and re-  
modeling of the cottage by  
means of County funds, is  
now underway with Miss  
Alice Coggins, the Home  
Economics teacher, super-  
vising. There will be a  
living room, dining room,  
bedroom, bath, kitchen and  
clothing laboratory in the  
cottage, which are to be  
furnished for the joint en-  
deavors of students and  
citizens of the community.

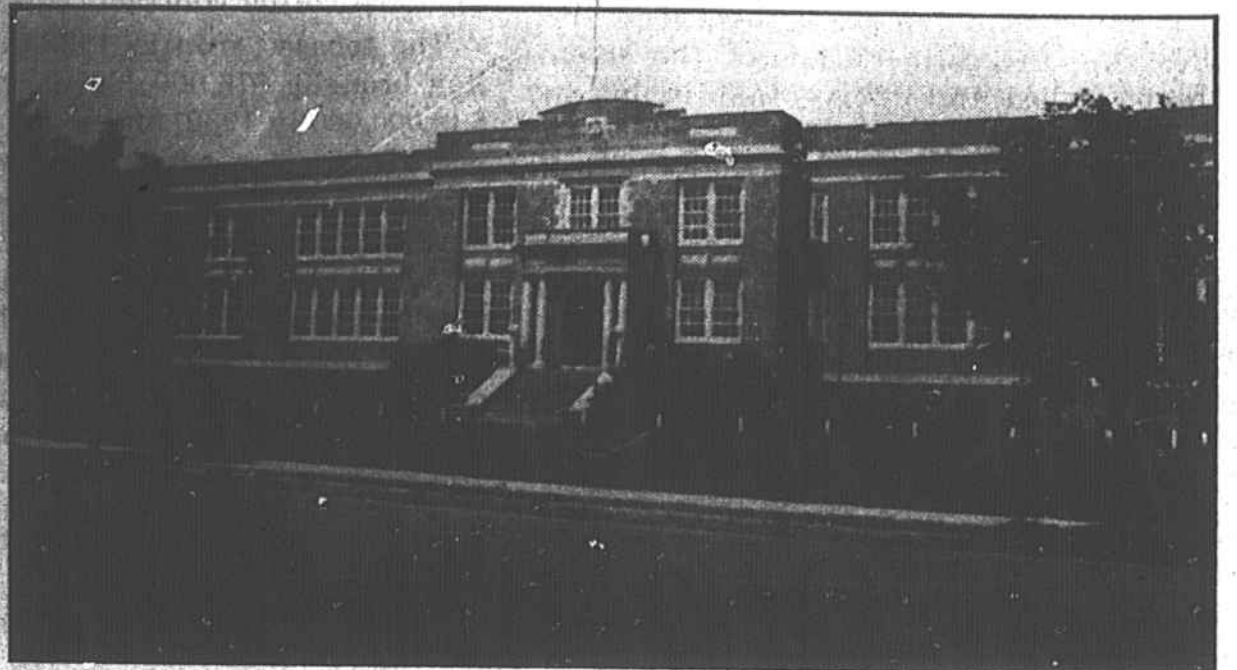
The class this year is ex-

### HORTON APARTMENTS

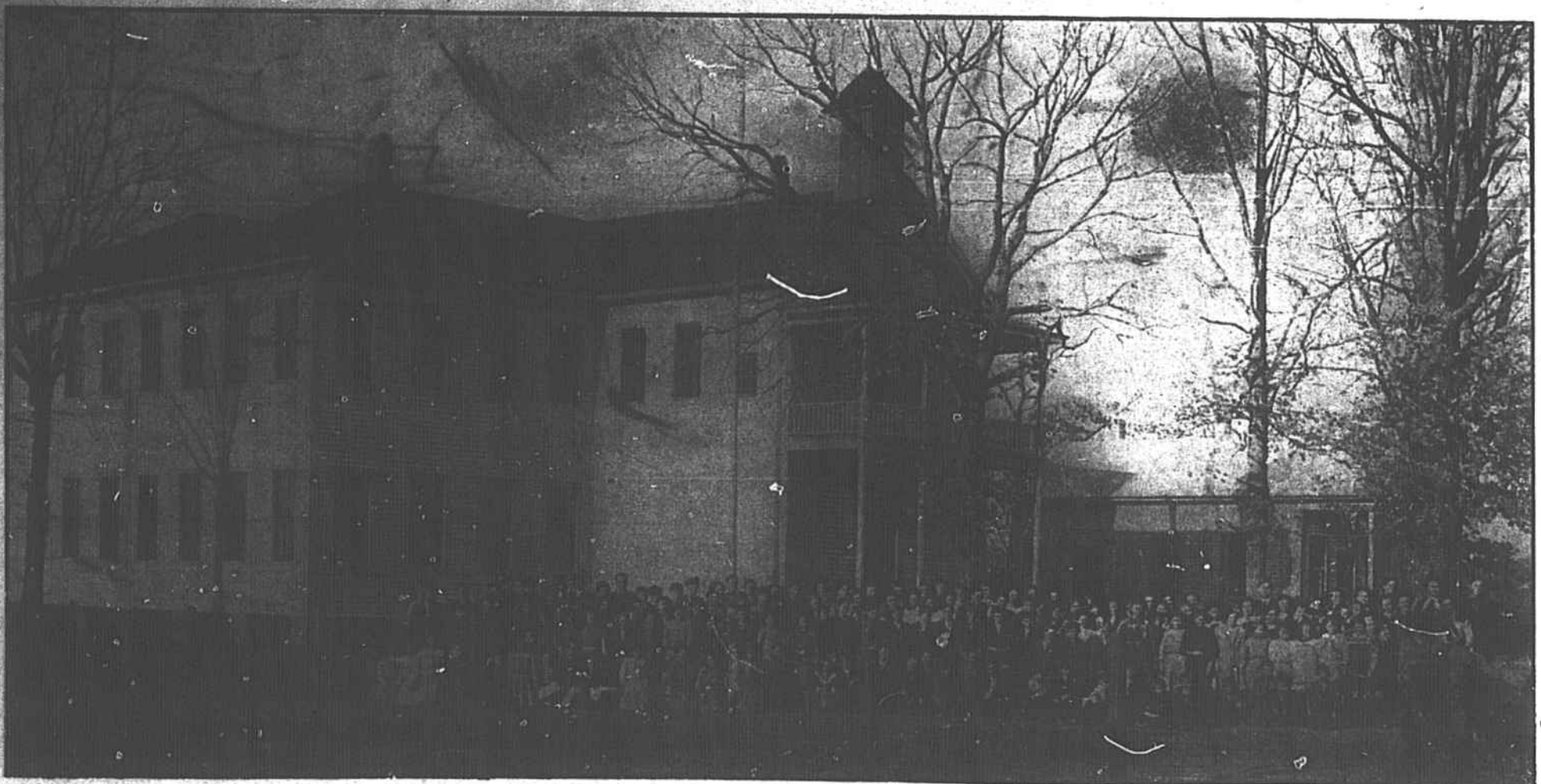
Known as the Pitt County Female Institute 77 years ago and later
