QUESTION: Are table scraps good for chickens? Thigpen, David, 1 lot J. L. H., 1 lot

ANSWER: Table scraps are usually an extremely concentrated, highly seasoned food and often produce dire results if the birds are allowed to gorge themselves. Where only a few birds are kept and fed only a grain ration the scraps undoubtedly supply some of the deficiencies brought about by such a feedings method. This system of feeding, however, does not bring out the best in the birds and causes low vitality a as well as a decreased production. Forbes, 1 a Tugwell. 1 res. Wilson For best results all birds should have the proper ration and be well housed.

> QUESTION: What grasses are ecommended for permanent pastures in North Carolina?

ANSWER: The grass mixtures vary with the type of soil and location. The grasses that would do well in the Coastal Plain section on loamy Eason, J. T., 1 lot Tom Vines house. Edwards, W. 
