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Fertilizing Value

A ton of cotton seed has approximately the same fertilizer ingredients as 1,053 pounds of cottonseed meal, says C. B. Williams, head of the agronomy department at State

But when meal is used as a source of nitrogen in applying a complete fertilizer to a crop, the yield is usually 10 percent higher, he says than when the nitrogen is obtained from cotton seed.

Therefore, Williams says, growers will usually find it profitable to fertilize with meal rather than with seed, though seed can be used when applied properly.
