balance is the other way, it withers away. Towns and cities operate under the same rules, no matter how obscure the application may be.

Per capita wealth does not always mean general prosperity, but it certainly insures the possibility of that desired state. Consider Farmville as one joint enterprise, with all citizens as stockholders. What each one spends, away from home, is money sent away; what each one sells, away from home is money brought in to offset the other total. If the money that arrives is greater than that sent away the civic entity grows, its surplus grows. If the balance is the other way, the civic enterprise withers, the balance constantly dwindles and the word "p-o-v-e-r-t-y" begins to be written on the wall.


