## IT'S TIME FOR THE FAIRS

It is estimated that something like three thousand county and community fairs will be staged in the United States during the next few months. These community fairs will range

between the extremes of excellence and worthlessness. Some of them will merely be an excuse for cheap carnival companies to set up midways that are marked by various gambling devices and undesirable shows. Others will present instruction through educational exhibits and aid in the development of trade and the upbuilding of the community in which they are held by the program set forth. The managers and directors of every community fair have the option of determining the character of the event, that they will stage.

In this connection, it is worth calling attention to the fact that the United States Government appropriates millions of dollars for participation in large fairs, such as the exhibitions to be staged by San Francisco and New York in the near future. The Government, through various departments, also participates in various State fairs and, occasionally, in some of the smaller events. If the Government can participate in the exhibitions held by large cities and provide millions of dollars for so doing, we see no reason why the Government cannot make an appropriation each year, of at least three to five million dollars, to provide for educational exhibits at the various county, or community fair in the nation. Of course, it will not be possible for the Government to be represented at every community gathering, but some participation is possible for hundreds of these fairs which annually attract thousands and thousands of people.




