

Lime and Legume Seed

The Agricultural Adjustment Agency will again allow North Carolina farmers to draw upon their 1941 allowance for conservation materials, it was announced here today by the State College Extension Service.

Where a farmers has used his maximum 1943 allowance, he may get lime or winter legume seed out of his 1944 allowance, up to an amount equal to that of his allowance on 1943, the announcement said. This, it was explained, it to allow the producer to obtain all conservation materials he needs to get his land in shape for the even greater production demands that will be made




