(Continued From Page One) ed to government employees, many of whom were receiving compensation from the government for the same meals.

In another case, he said, a contractor charged, and the contracting officer allowed, a payment of \$70,480 for gasoline taxes paid by the contractor in California, when the tax was not chargeable. The amount, he said, was recovered by the contracting office.

"Grogg, gin, brandy, rum, scotch, bourbon and rye whiskey," he declared, were charged for to the amount of \$10,000 but were issued in six 600-cc. cans.
