## NO IMPROVEMENT EXPECTED IN FERTILIZER SUPPLY

The potash supply available to North Carolina farmers during the next fertilizer season may be slightly less than during the 1944-45 crop year, superphosphate is now running short of demand, and nitrogen is expected to be placed under Government allocation soon to guarantee equity in distribution throughout the nation, according to J. W. Wizeman, chief of the Civilian Production Administration's Inorganics Branch, who spoke to agricultural leaders. farmers, and representatives of the fertilizer industry in Raleigh recently at a conference called to consider fertilizer grades to be recommended for adoption at the next meeting of the State Board of Agriculture.

Declaring that the world supply of nitrogen is approximately 1 million tons less than the need, Wizeman emphasized that the War Department is now laying plans to send larger quantities of nitrogen to countries under U. S. occupation forces.

Wizeman attributed the relative shortage of superphosphate to the inavailability of phosphate rosk and sulphuric acid, adding that "Midwest newcomers" in the use of potash will absorb large quantities of increased production of this fertilizer material.


