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**SEPT. 15 DEADLINE FOR USNR OFFICERS JOIN REGULAR NAVY**

Charleston, S. C., Aug. 8—The Navy has designated Sept. 15, as the deadline for submission of applications for transfer of Naval Reserve and temporary USN officers to the regular Navy.

With certain exceptions applications will not be accepted after that date.

This deadline does not apply to officers who request transfer to the regular Navy as Law Specialists; officers who will have completed less than one year's commission in the service on Sept. 15; and officers who receive their first commission subsequent to Sept. 15.

A deadline of July 20 had already been established for officers applying for transfer as chief warrant officers or warrant officers.

The Sept. 15 deadline applies to officers on terminal leave and inactive duty as well as officers on active duty.

**TREASURER REPORTS ON PITT TUBERCULOSIS CONTROL FUND**

Mrs. D. L. Moore, Greenville, who in May accepted the office of treasurer for the Pitt County Seal Sale, has just reported through the general chairman, Dr. N. Thomas Emmett, expenses of the County Tuberculosis Control Program for the first seven months of the year.

Total expenditures were \$2476.74. Mrs. Moore reported that \$992 of the total went for xrays. \$127.13 went to the State Association in March, and the balance was expended for supplies.

The general seal sale chairman called attention to the large amount expended for xrays and explained that this was the only way to make an early diagnosis of tuberculosis. He also calls attention to the fact that plans are now being laid for the 1946 sale in Pitt County.

**COPY OF ADVERTISEMENT FOR POWER PLANT IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE TOWN OF FARMVILLE, N. C.**

Sealed proposals will be received by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Farmville, N. C., until 2:00 P. M., August 15, 1946, at the Town Hall in Farmville, for Power Plant Improvements enumerated as follows:

SECTION I. Furnishing, delivering and installing a 4 cycle Diesel Engine-driven generating unit having a capacity of approximately 820 K. W. at 80% P. F. and a speed not exceeding 300 R.P.M., including all auxiliary equipment.

SECTION II. Furnishing and delivering switchboard and switchgear equipment.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a certified check, drawn on some bank or trust company authorized to do business in North Carolina, payable to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the Town of Farmville, N. C., in an amount equal to five (5) per cent of the amount of the bid, as a guarantee that the contract will be entered into within ten (10) days after and if awarded the bond will be executed.

A performance bond will be required of the successful bidder in an amount equal to one hundred (100) per cent of the contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract and upon the payment in full to all persons supplying labor and furnishing materials, equipment and/or apparatus for and in connection with the construction of the project.

General contractors are notified that "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting," ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925, and as subsequently amended, will be observed in receiving and awarding general contracts.
