### SEPARATE PULLETS AND MALES EARLY

When chicks are 5 to 6 weeks old, remove the male birds and place them in a separate enclosure, finishing them off as broilers. Retain only those cockerels needed for breeding purposes. Removal of the males gives pullets additional room and eliminates crowding at the feed troughs. They will do better and the poultry raiser realizes a saving in feed costs. Keep in your flocks of medium and heavy breeds only one male to every 15 females. For Leghorns and other light breeds the ratio should be about one rooster to every 20 hens.

Keep the best cockerels for breeding. Here are some guide rules to follow:

1. High quality chicks are cheapest in the long run.
  2. Look for good feathering. Mark all chicks which have long pin feathers in their wings at hatching time or tall feathers at 10 days of age.
  3. Keep for later selection the largest cockerels at 8 to 12 weeks old.
  4. Retain all cockerels that are free of standard disqualifications and have no body deformities. Look for points on the sides of comb and feathers on shanks, toes and between the toes. Get rid of any with these disqualifications. Eliminate the runts and slow-feathering birds.
- When your pullet flock begins laying, do not house males and females together until the production of hatching eggs is started. It is best to produce market eggs which are infertile.
