

**DUKE AND CAROLINA ROTC STUDENTS TO TAKE CRUISE**

Naval ROTC students at the University of North Carolina and Duke University will be among the 3555 Naval ROTC midshipmen who will cruise from West Coast Ports this summer as part of their training for officers' commissions in the Navy and Marine Corps.

These midshipmen, who are getting their college education and naval training at units established at 52 colleges and universities throughout the nation, will assemble at San Francisco about June 23. They will sail from there a few days later for cruises to various Pacific ports.

Of the 3555 midshipmen, 3235 are studying for commissions in the regular U. S. Navy and U. S. Marine Corps. The others are training for commissions in the Naval Reserve.

Approximately 1970 students of senior and sophomore classes, all of whom are training for regular commissions, are scheduled to depart from San Francisco on June 26, in the battleship USS IOWA and the mod-

ern light cruisers USS Pasadena, USS Springfield and USS Astoria. They will proceed to Seattle, Wash., for a five-day liberty and recreation period over the Fourth of July. Other ports to be visited on the eight-week cruise will be Long Beach, Pearl Harbor and San Diego. At the latter port the midshipmen will receive training in the newest methods of amphibious warfare. After a short period of gunnery exercises they will disembark at San Francisco on August 21.

Two aircraft carriers, the Boxer and the Princeton, will cruise another group of 1265 junior students who are training for regular commissions. Leaving San Francisco on June 26, they will also have an eight-week cruise carrying them to Pearl Harbor, San Diego, and other California ports. Their training will be directed toward teaching them the latest developments in naval aviation.

The third cruise will be for the 320 students who are training for commissions in the Naval Reserve. Plans are for them to leave San Francisco on June 26 for a 21-day cruise aboard the light cruiser, the Duluth.

The schedule includes a good will visit to Victoria, British Columbia, over the Fourth of July as well as later stops at Long Beach, California.

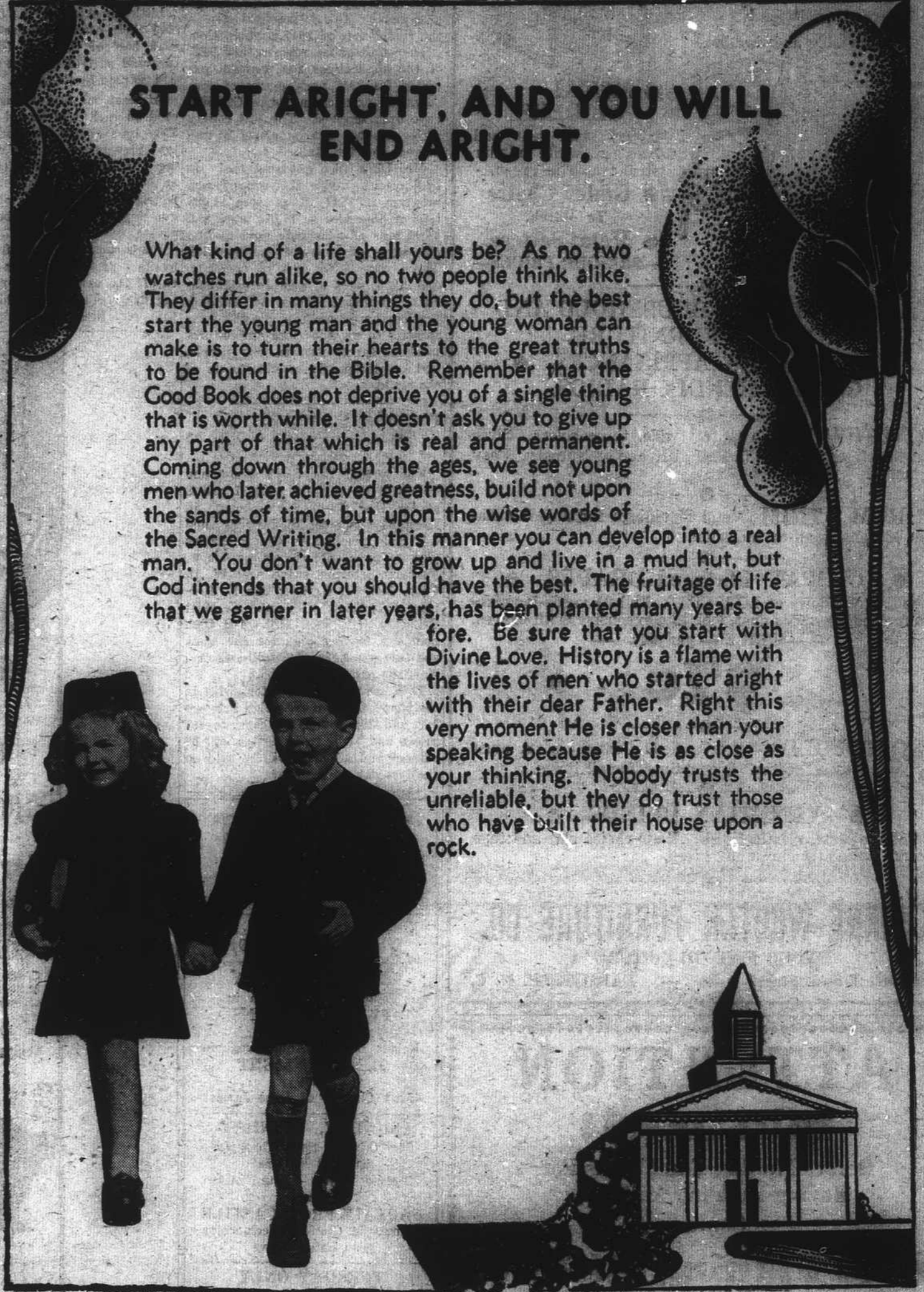

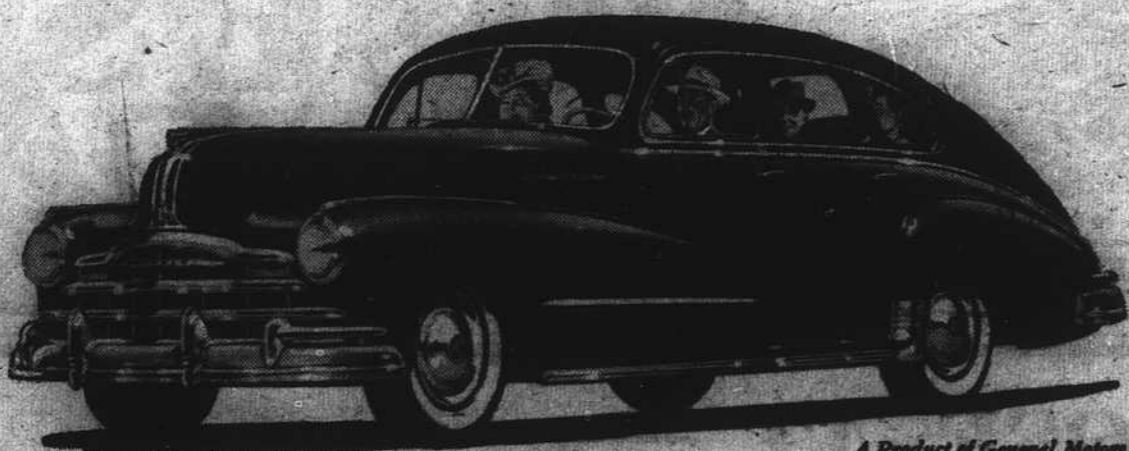
