The most elaborate tour is planned at Edenton April 8, 9, 10 when the old soundside town will present 22 places during "Old Home Week," including historic town houses and plantations.

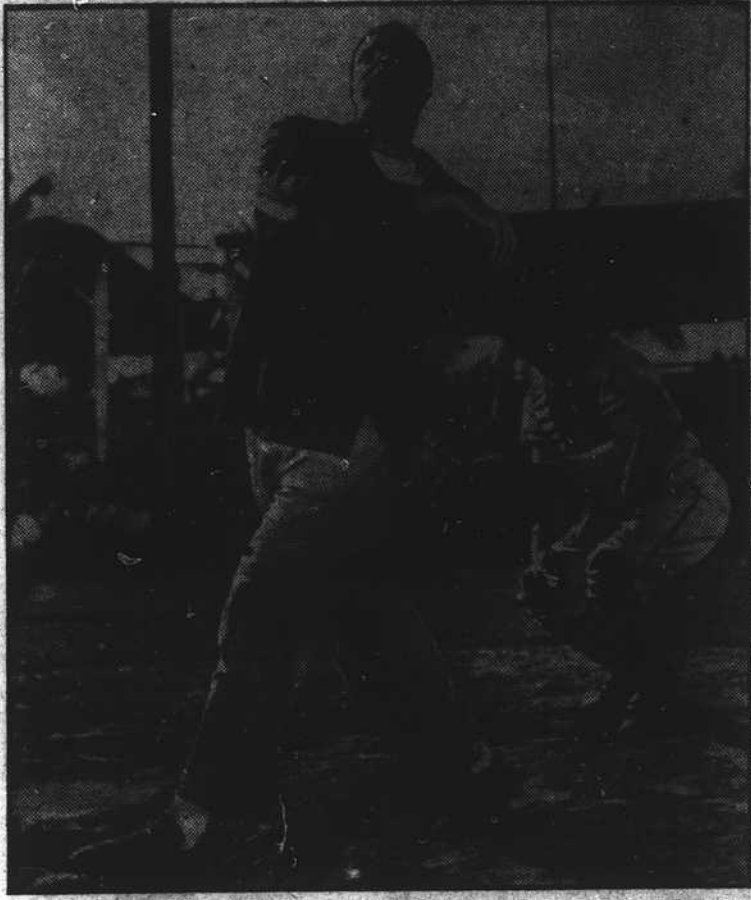

Town's New Traffic Ordinances

An Ordinance Regulating Parking Of Trucks On Streets Of The Town Of Farmville, N. C. To Protect The Streets Thereof.

R. O. Lang, Jr., moved the adoption of the following ordinance: "Whereas the unregulated parking of truck tractors and truck trailers are greatly damaging the paved streets of the Town of Farmville;

"Whereas overnight parking by said trucks in the fire district would constitute a menace to the efficient operation of the fire department in case of a fire in the fire district;

NOW THEREFORE BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF FARMVILLE in regular session on Tuesday, February 1st, 1949, that:

1. That no truck tractor and/or truck trailer be allowed to park on any of the paved streets of the Town of Farmville from 6:00 o'clock P. M. until 6:00 o'clock A. M.; that all truck tractors and/or truck trailers are hereby prohibited from parking on any paved streets of the Town of Farmville, N. C., between the hours of 6:00 P. M. and 6:00 A. M.;

2. That all persons, firms and/or corporations are hereby prohibited from lowering the iron wheels on truck trailers to the paved streets of the Town of Farmville at all time streets of Farmville shall at all time said iron wheel or wheels.

3. That no person, firm or corporation shall park or cause to be parked any dual wheel truck within the fire district of the Town of Farmville or on any streets immediately adjacent to the fire district of said Town of Farmville, N. C., nor on any part of Main or Wilson streets Streets of the Town of Farmville, N. C., between the hours of 6:00 o'clock P. M. and 6:00 o'clock A. M.

That this ordinance shall be effective from and after the 1st day of March, 1949."

J. M. Stansill seconded the motion and upon a vote, the same was unanimously adopted.

R. O. Lang, Jr., moved the adoption of the following ordinance: "Whereas no sidewalks have been paved alongside much of the paved streets in the Town of Farmville, N. C.;

"And whereas many persons cultivate vacant properties adjoining paved streets and in many instances cultivate the lands up to the curbstones of said paved streets, dragging dirt and rubbish into the gutter lines, breaking the pavement and depriving other citizens of the Town of the use of said lands immediately adjacent to said paved streets as a sidewalk;

"NOW THEREFORE BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF FARMVILLE, N. C., in regular session on Tuesday, February 1st, 1949, that:

no person, firm or corporation shall cultivate, plow, plant thereon or otherwise obstruct any lands within seven feet of the concrete curbing of any paved streets in the Town of Farmville; that no person, firm or corporation shall do anything to prevent the use of a strip of land outside of the curb stone on any paved street, seven feet in width, from use as a sidewalk by the citizens of said Town of Farmville, N. C.

"BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that no person, firm or corporation shall plow, cultivate, plant thereon or otherwise obstruct lands within seven feet of the apparent gutter line on any dirt streets in the Town of Farmville, N. C.

That this ordinance shall be in effect from and after February 1st, 1949."

R. O. Lang, Jr., moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

"Whereas traffic has become congested on Walnut Street between Belcher and Wilson Streets due to location of Melton's Garage in the middle thereof and the fact that the East Carolina Terminal and loading tracks are located thereon together with fact that said street is not normal in width and has a curbstone on only one side;

"NOW THEREFORE BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Farmville, N. C., that Walnut Street between Wilson and Belcher Streets be and it is hereby designated as a one-way street from and after the effective date of this ordinance and that all traffic proceeding

along this street after said effective date shall move only in a southwesterly direction, that is from Belcher Street toward Wilson Street.

That this ordinance shall be in effect from and after March 1, 1949." C. H. Flanagan seconded said motion and upon vote same was unanimously adopted.
