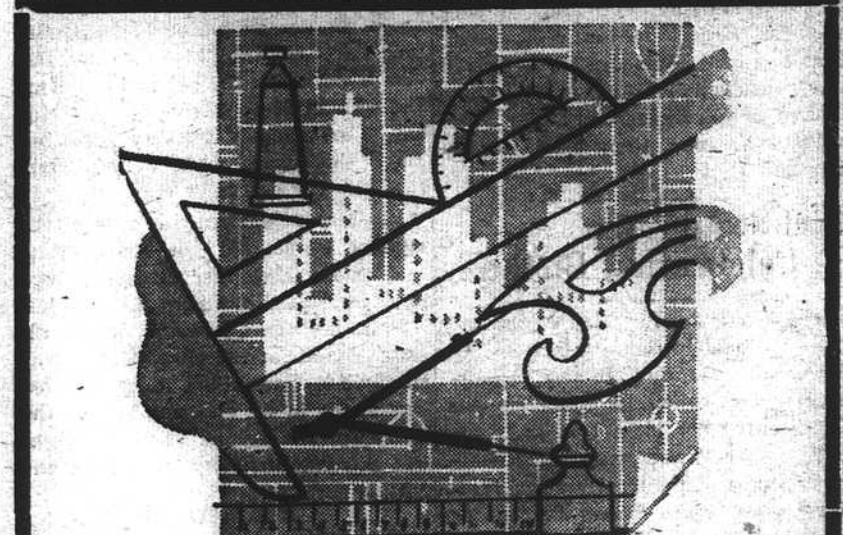
first chapter of Luke as the devotional for Circle 4 Monday afternoon. The theme was "Lord, Teach Us to Pray," which was further emphasized
