Among these are: Dr. C. Newman Hogle, Pastor of Freeport Methodist Church, Freeport, N. Y., and Professor of Marriage Counseling at New York University; the Rev. D. D. Holt, Pastor of Trinity Methodist Church, Dur-

ham, N. C.; the Rev. J. T. Greene, Director of Family Life Education for the North Carolina Conference; and Rev. C. P. Morris, Executive Secretary of the North Carolina Conference Board of Education. Other speakers and participants are the Rev. A. J. Hobbs, Superintendent of the Rocky Mount District; Rev. T. Melh. Grant, pastor of First Methodist Church, Rocky Mount; Rev. H. G. Ruark, pastor of Weldon Methodist Church; Rev. Bill Wells, pastor of Warrenton Methodist Circuit; and Mrs. J. H. Cutchins, representing the Woman's Society of Christian Service of the N. C. Conference.

The morning session will emphasize the role of the church in family life education, while the afternoon session will deal mostly with marriage counseling. The women delegates will meet in separate session in the afternoon for a discussion of the function of the Woman's Society of Christian Service in promoting Christian Family Living, while the ministers will have a seminar on the techniques and types of situations encountered in marriage and family counseling.

#### Employers Now Under Social Security Law

Persons who work for themselves are now covered under the social security law and have been building insurance protection for themselves and their families since January 1, 1951.

The recent amendments to the Social Security Act cover most self-employed people with the exception of some occupations such as farmers, doctors, lawyers, funeral directors, and a few other professional groups. For many people who work for themselves their first social security tax report will be due, along with income tax returns, March 15, 1952, and will cover the calendar year 1951. Any earnings from self-employment of \$400 or more are covered by the provisions of this new law.

The tax rate for this year is 2 1/2% of net earnings up to \$3000. Those

who have an annual self-employment income of less than \$400 will not have to pay social security taxes and will not be covered by the law. The new coverage is not a voluntary proposition, but mandatory.

This new social security law will cover about 4,700,000 self-employed persons who now will have an opportunity to build towards retirement benefits for themselves and their families and monthly benefits to

their dependent survivors in the event of death.

For details about their new rights under social security, self-employed people should get in touch with their nearest social security office.

The social security office in Rocky Mount is located in the post office building and is open from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., Monday through Friday. You may visit this office or write for information.

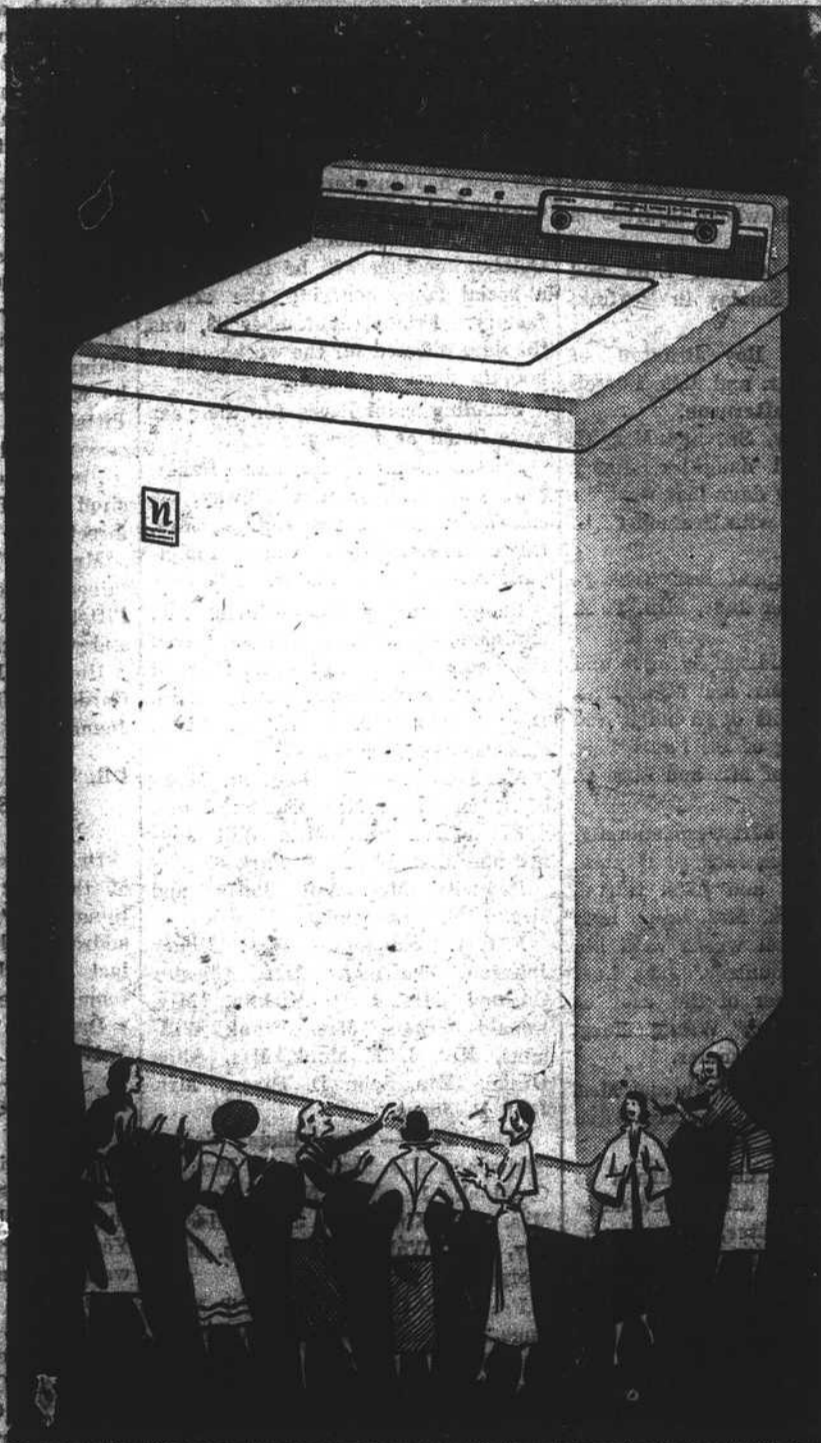

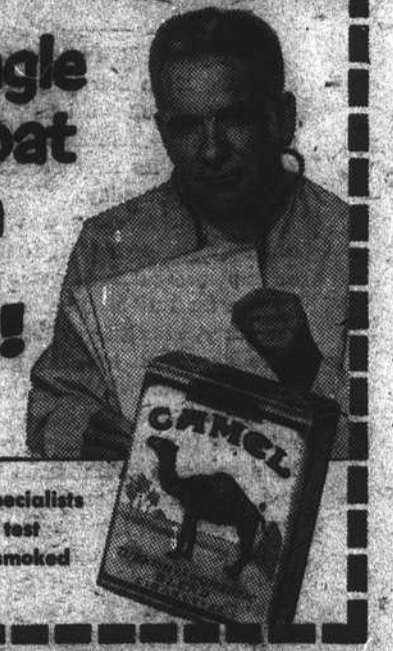
