## State Motor Vehicle Registraton Increases

Motor vehicle registration which zoomed past the million mark last February, stood at 1,192,430 at the

end of June, the Department of Motor Vehicles has reported.

Top registrations was Mecklenburg with 107,742 followed by Guilford with 65,321. Wake and Forsyth were in third and fourth place with 54,480 and 42,652 respectively.

Smallest registration was reported from Clay with 922. The figures include both private and publicly owned vehicles and trailers, the Department said.

Fitt county had 268 public vehicles and 16,146 privately-owned vehicles as of June 30. Greene county had 73 and 4,077 vehicles, respectively.
