Willie Schneider, the eighteen-yearold Austrian spirit medium who is said to produce phenomena more startling than any in the annals of psychical research, under test conditions more rigid than those heretofore imrosed on mediums, is now baffling Earope's most scientific investigators and scientists, according to an advance publication of the proceedings of the British Society for Psychical

Dr. Eric Dingwall, of New York, research officer for the society and known as one of the skeptical and keen investigators acquainted with nearly all the tricks employed by mediums, reperting a sitting with Schneider last May in Munich, Germany, in the laboratory of Baron von Schrenck-Notzing, said that "held as he was, no one could posisbly produce such phenomena normally."
