RESTORE OLD ART

Workmen Bring to Light Glories of Westminster Abbey;

Removal of Varnish From Ancient Shields Reveals Beauty of Work Done Seven Centuries Ago.

After having been hidden for generations a new wealth of beauty has been brought to light during the restoration work in Westminster abbey.

These shields, which are believed to be the oldest specimens of architectural heraldry in the world, were placed there by Henry III, when the building was new.

The biggest "find" has been the gorgeous decoration of the tomb of Edmund Crouchback and two others on the north side of the high altar.

One of the renovators was found busy at work on the back of the sedilia. Here the other day a magnificent painting was exhumed from the grime of centuries.

It is less than a year since the work began, and there are more artistic and quaint treasures waiting to be brought to light.

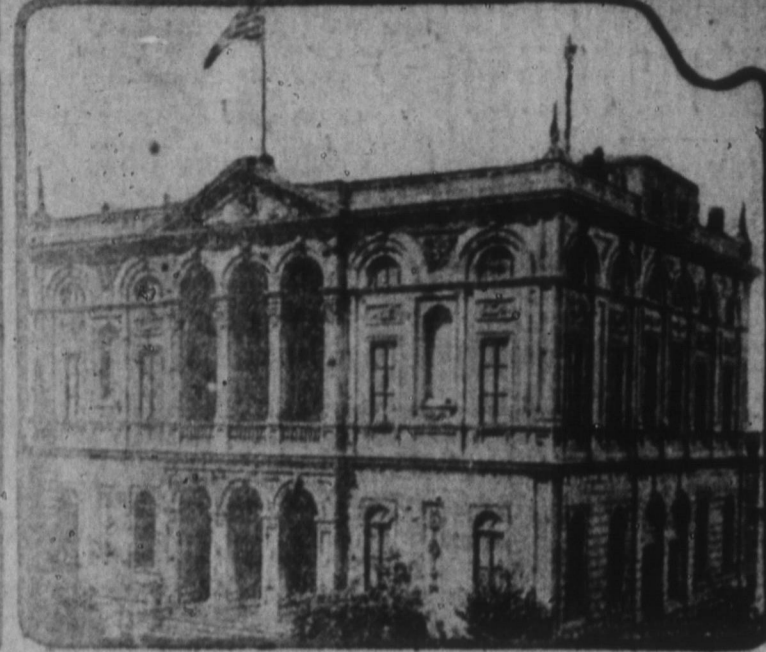
