Street Car Election Which Has INSURANCE COM-MISSIONER SPEAKS AT STATESVILLE Threatened The City Is Called Off STATESVILLE, Judo 20, - Insur-In Special Meeting Of The Board

AFTER DEEP STUFF

The street car election that has seen threatening Goldsboro for the past three or four weeks threatens no longer. The city fathers meeting in apecial session last night seriously onsidered their former action and clared that the election was all off, ports and advertisements to the antrary notwithstanding.

The solons were sitting in solemn session when a resolution was sprung alling for a recalling of the progoed election, the carrying of which mean that Goldsboro would bluot have to father the present street railway system, and the resolution was passed without any important discussion or opposition.

Several weeks ago the board of aldermen took it upon themselves to call an election to see whether the city of Goldsboro, favorably known as "The Gate City of Eastern Carolina" would take over and operate the street car system that is now so evident in track and so lacking in street cars.

The board thought well of calling the election at that time, but since, then they have seen the error of their way, if their way was one of error, and many think it was, and have reconsidered the matter and it is all
