WOULD PREVENT ACCIDENTS WHICH CAUSE BLINDNESS

New York, Aug. 22.—Because of the growing seriousness of accidents in public places and in homes, as well as in industry, as a cause of blindness, the National Committee For the Prevention of Blindness announced today that it would undertake immediately a progressive census of all eye accidents with a view of determining means of prevention. This decision, the committee declares grew out of the recent realization that there has come about a radical change in the incidence of the various principal cause of blindness.

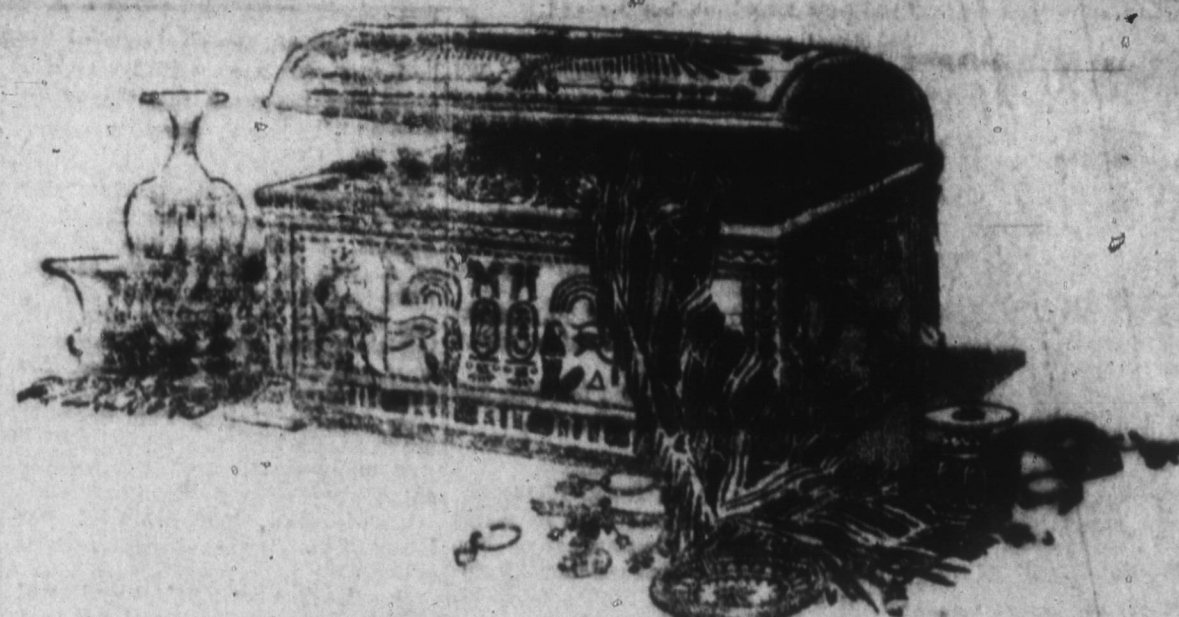

MOUNT OLIVE

Mount Olive, Aug. 22.—The farm home of L. B. Dill, about 1 miles N. of Mount Olive, was destroyed by fire Monday afternoon. In addition to the building, practically all the contents were likewise burned, together with a quantity of tobacco, stored upstairs. The origin of the fire is undetermined. The loss is at least \$5,000, with about \$2,500 insurance.
