That mighty and heroic blow by Stengel, who came back after being relegated to baseball's scrap heap not fong ago ended a gripping and pulse throbbing drama, a thrilling battle in which the wits, decisive punch and brilliatn defense of the Giants triumphed over the courage and fighting spirit of the Yankees. RECEIVERSHIP FOR GERMANY HIS IDEA

(By the Associated Press.) New York, Oct. 6 Receivership for Germany, a more sympathetic interest in European affairs by America and a modification of the Volstead act to allow five per cent alcoholicontent were some of the recoramendations voiced by Senator Couzens of Michigan, who returned today from a tour of Europe.

He said he believed Henry Ford would be elected president if he were nominated by any of the reognized parties but did not hazard a guess as to Ford's chances of obtaining the

The Senator said his study of conditions in Germany had convince him that the only solution would be receivership for Germany.

"It is perfectly ridiculous for the great United States" he said, "to stand aside without even having an opinion. America should take a sympathetic interest without entering

the world Court." While expressing sympathy with France in her effort to get back omething for war damage, Senato Couzens said he was more in favoof any plan which would relieve th present intolerable condition of the masses in Germany.
