Anderson of Wilson Appointed Head of the Credit Union

Raleigh, N. C., Nov. 2.-Announce ment, was made here today by Dean B. F. Brown of the Department of Business Administration, State college, of the appointment of A. E. Anderson, of Wilson, as superintendent of Credit Unions for the Division of Markets of State College and the Department of Agriculture.

The credit unions of the Division of Markets are proving to be o' great value in the State, said Dean Brown, but not all of them have functioned properly due to the fact that other important work has madit impossible for the department to, luck. kee up with them.

"Thirty-six credit unions have club members. been organized," he said "and the central and west central portions of the state are fairly well covered and the credit needs of members in these sections are well taken care of. We are now planning to enlarge our present leaders to falter now., credit union activities just as fasi igent system of the extension ser lice in carrying out these plans. At present leaders, first our corts will be limited to 'hos districts where the credit needs ray.

"The credit union theory is twofold. The first is that the union promote thrift and savings, and while this is a most important feature, it is possibly not the outstanding feature. The fact that the unions are organizations for the creaion of group credit would probaby be the most important feature of he credit union group. This we car exxplain by using for example tweny men none of whom had any credt standing. By forming these men into an organization they ca by this joint action secure credit that they could NOT get separately."

In making plans for expansion o the eredit union work Dean Brown aphasized that these organization: are, in no way competitors of the egularly established banks. In fat ne stated that they are supplemenary to the banks and help promote the idea of sound business, principle is taught by banks.




